Rapid Response

- FCMP Strategic Plan -Partner agencies helped envision priorities for the future
- One Priority was the addressing Orphan Debris
 - Respond to debris that is not covered in an existing program
 - Regional teams
 - Evolved into rapid response marine debris

Rapid Response overview

The Florida Marine Debris Rapid Response Program is envisioned as:

- State-wide Program
- Regional teams with lead contacts in 5-7 regions of the state
- Multiple partners with state, local and federal authorities
- Marine debris reported locally then response ramps up
- Contractor-based removal for large debris items
- Currently only Southeast region functioning, Northwest is initializing
- Respondents contact lead, and response is directed through central coordination for CZM or other source funding and to secure contractors



Rapid Response overview

What types of marine debris could be considered for this program?

- Large fishing nets, shipping materials, pieces of structures, vessels, heavy industrial garbage, etc.
- Rapid response required when debris immediately threatens human safety, and marine habitat or species

2012 Coastal Partnership Initiative Grants
