## SECOND AMENDED EMERGENCY FINAL ORDER

Pursuant to the authority granted to me by Sections 120.569(2)(n), 252.36, and 252.46, Florida Statutes, and upon consideration of the State of Florida Executive Order Nos. 16-230 and 16-274, I hereby find that the emergency conditions set forth in Emergency Final Order dated October 5, 2016, issued in response to the imminent or immediate danger to the public, health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the State of Florida resulting from the devastation wrought by Hurricane Matthew continue to exist in the following counties: Brevard, Clay, Duval, Flagler, Indian River, Martin, Nassau, Orange, Osceola, Putnam, Seminole, St. Johns, St. Lucie, and Volusia counties and hereby extend said Emergency Final Order through January 1, 2017.

## **NOTICE OF RIGHTS**

Pursuant to Section 120.569(2)(n), Florida Statutes, any party adversely affected by this Order has the right to seek an injunction of this Order in circuit court or judicial review of it under Section 120.68, Florida Statutes. Judicial review must be sought by filing a notice of appeal under Rule 9.110 of the Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure, with the Clerk of the Department in the Office of General Counsel, 3900 Commonwealth Boulevard, Mail Station #35, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-3000, and by filing a copy of the notice of appeal, accompanied by the applicable filing fees, with the appropriate district court of appeal. The notice of appeal must be filed within thirty (30) days after this Order is filed with the Clerk of the Department.
