Thank you for your interest in participating in the SEAFAN BleachWatch Observer Network, and for your help in providing valuable information about the condition of southeast Florida's coral reefs. Your participation is an important component of an early warning system for coral bleaching and disease on the Florida Reef Tract.

There are many questions about coral bleaching and disease that must be answered in order to fully assess the environmental impact of bleaching/disease events. Where and when is it taking place? Which species are more vulnerable? What is the duration and severity of the bleaching or disease event? And finally, what is the recovery and resilience potential of the southeast Florida coral reef ecosystem? By submitting observer reports on a regular basis, you will help answer some of these challenging questions.
