Program Change Submission

Introduction

The Florida Coastal Management Program (FCMP) manages over 8,000 miles of coastline through the authority granted by the Florida Legislature in 24 different statutes. This network of statutes is administered by nine state agencies, including all of the water management districts, throughout the state of Florida. In the 2020 legislative session, 2 new sections were added to the statutes governing the FCMP through proposed new enforceable policies and other sections which will not be proposed as enforceable policies.

The State of Florida has completed the following analysis of these changes according to the requirements of 15 C.F.R. s. 923 Subpart H and concludes that these are Program Changes as defined in 15 C.F.R. s. 923.84, with the term "Program Change" defined in 15 C.F.R. s. 923.80. New sections are being proposed as enforceable policies and were created in Chapters 258 and 403 of the Florida Statutes (F.S.). However, it does not substantially change the FCMP in the areas of uses subject management, special management areas, boundaries, authorities and organization, or coordination, public involvement, and the national interest. Five existing, enforceable policies were repealed during the 2020 legislative session. FCMP is not submitting modifications of existing enforceable policies in this Program Change submission.

The State of Florida is requesting that the Office for Coastal Management (OCM) of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) concur in the incorporation of these Program Changes to the FCMP

Analysis of Changes

The submitted program changes amend the State of Florida's enforceable policies of the Florida Coastal Management Program. The State of Florida submits the changes to Chapters 161, 252, 258, 339, 373, 376, 379, 381, and 403 of the Florida Statutes as Program Changes to the FCMP, with 258.3991 and 403.0855, F.S., being proposed as enforceable policies for federal consistency purposes. Pursuant to 15 C.F.R. s. 923.84, this submitted analysis of changes places the OCM on notice of the submitted Program Changes.

In September 2019,15 C.F.R s. 923 was updated with new rules that replaced the previous 1996 guidance and its 2013 Addendum. Under the updated rule, all changes (including amendments and modifications mentioned in 16 U.S.C. S. 1455) submitted to NOAA are considered in rule as "program changes" as defined in 15 C.F.R. s. 923.80, with the program change criteria defined in 15 C.F.R. s. 923.84. Program changes now include all changes to enforceable policies, as well as changes to one of the following management program areas under 15 C.F.R. s. 923: Uses Subject to Management, Special Management Areas, Boundaries, Authorities and Organization, and Coordination, Public Involvement and National Interest.

The Program Changes for 2020 which are being submitted as enforceable policies are summarized below, while all statutes that are being added (including non-enforceable policies for federal consistency purposes) are outlined in the following table.

Chapter 258, F.S.

Section 258.3991, F.S., was created, which created the new Nature Coast Aquatic Preserve along the shoreline stretching from Pasco County to Citrus County on the Gulf Coast. The boundaries for the new Aquatic Preserve are set in this new section. The boundaries created in this section are where existing protections and requirements for actions within aquatic preserves will be applied within the Nature Coast Aquatic Preserve. This would mean that restrictions for USACE permits that would apply to submerged lands within aquatic preserves would also apply to submerged lands within the boundaries of the Nature Coast Aquatic Preserve.

Chapter 403, F.S.

Section 403.0855, F.S., was created dealing with biosolids management to help minimize the migration of nutrients that impair water bodies. The new section includes additional permit requirements for biosolids land application site permits or permit renewals that were submitted after July 1, 2021. These requirements include minimum unsaturated soil depth between the depth of biosolid placement and the depth of the water table. All permits shall comply with the requirements listed in the section by July 1, 2022. Since this could apply to federal facilities that were building a new wastewater treatment plant (like an Air Force base) where they wanted to land apply their biosolids, this is being submitted as an enforceable policy.

Examination of Florida Statutes

For 2020, the FCMP developed and submitted a strategy in its 2021-2025 CZM Chapter 309 Assessment and Strategies submission. The strategy will have FCMP and its partner state agencies develop draft narrative versions of FCMP's enforceable policies for submittal to our federal partners. Alongside the development of draft narrative versions of these policies, another part of this strategy will look to review FCMP's enforceable policies with the relevant partner state agencies and water management districts who have the best knowledge of these Florida Statute sections.

FCMP anticipates enhanced coordination with its partner state agencies for this legacy review through an approved CZM Chapter 309 strategy, which had been submitted by FCMP as part of its latest Chapter 309 Assessment and Strategies. The Assessment and Strategies were approved by NOAA OCM in Summer 2020.

The Department of Environmental Protection's Office of Resilience and Coastal Protection has requested the concurrence of the federal Office for Coastal Management (OCM) of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), in updating the statutory authorities included within the Florida Coastal Management Program (FCMP) as a program change. The Department of Environmental Protection has submitted these changes as a "program change" based on the decision criteria in 15 CFR 923.84.

This program change submission will incorporate relevant new Florida Statutes enacted by the Florida Legislature during the 2020 legislative session into the Florida Coastal Management Program. This includes incorporation of Sections 258.3991 and 403.0855, Florida Statutes, as enforceable policies for federal consistency purposes. The program change submittal is available at
