

Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) Manual



LWCF Eligible Projects

Eligible applicants include county governments and incorporated municipalities of the state of Florida and other legally constituted local governmental entities with the legal responsibility for the provision of outdoor recreational sites and facilities for the use and benefit of the general public.



Ineligible Projects

- No Site Control of the project boundary
- Project Site is not a Viable Recreation Area
- Support facilities more than 50% of the total project cost
- A project site would not be considered practical if it has documented and unresolved environmental violations
- Duplicate Projects or Overlapping Projects





LWCF Site Eligibility

Site Eligibility

Applicants must have and demonstrate adequate site control of project sites and are able to construct, operate, and maintain the area for the period of time sufficient to satisfy the dedication period as required the LWCF rule and Program Manual.

Warranty Deed
Quit-Claim Deed

Property Appraiser report cards, surveys, and maps are not sufficient evidence of site control. Use agreements are also insufficient.



Proper Site Control Documentation

Warranty Deed

Older deeds may not specify which type they are, and you will need to read the deed to see if it contains language guaranteeing that the person transferring the title has good title to the property. If this language is included, the deed is a warranty deed.

Quit-Claim Deed

Means that the person transferring the property didn't guarantee that they had good title to the property. In these cases, the department requires that you submit a thirty-year title search, with copies of all title-related documents, <u>AND</u> an attorney's opinion that the title search establishes good title in the applicant and that none of the encumbrances on the property will interfere with the proposed uses for the property.

Special Warranty Deed

If there are **exceptions** listed in the deed, or if the deed is titled a **special warranty deed** it means there are encumbrances on the property. These may be easements, covenants and restrictions, or other recorded documents that affect title to the property. This means that other people have enforceable property rights that could interfere with your proposed use of the property. If this is the case, you need an attorney's opinion that the exceptions listed in the deed won't interfere with the uses planned for the park. You will also need to include copies of those recorded documents in your site control documentation.



Proper Site Control Documentation

- Deeds frequently attach the legal description as an exhibit. Make sure the legal description is included in your application. Deeds without a legal description are not sufficient.
- Make sure the legal description in the deed matches the legal description on your boundary map, survey, conceptual site plan, or other documentation.
- Make sure your site control documentation covers the entire site. If your proposed site covers more than one parcel, make sure all relevant deeds are included and provide a map showing which deed relates to which parcel.
- If the transfer was by plat and dedication, make sure the dedication on the plat is readable. If the print is too small, provide both the entire plat and an enlarged copy of just the dedication.



Title Commitment or Title Policy

A title policy and or title commitment is useful mainly if copies of all exceptions and a title opinion stating that none of the exceptions will preclude the trail is included.



The Department encourages anyone with site control questions or concerns, to contact our Program Attorney, Lois LaSeur, so that she may review **BEFORE** you submit inadequate documentation.

Please note that submittal of any deeds, lease agreements, or title documents does not automatically guarantee that the applicant has properly demonstrated site control for the proposed project site. The staff will thoroughly review submitted site control documents for sufficiency, noting any deficiencies.

PRIMARY RECREATION AREAS AND FACILITIES: Primary facilities include all recreation facilities and opportunities. Primary cost must be equal to or greater than fifty percent (50%) of the total cost. Primary examples are: beach access, picnic facilities, fishing piers, ball fields, tennis courts, trails, trailheads, shade structures for recreational facilities, etc. Enclosed structures are not eligible costs. Costs of planning and site preparation should be included within the cost of each element. If land value is used as match, it should be included under primary cost. If this is a trail project, list the uses or types of trails. If developing one trail for multi-purposes state multi-purpose trail, but if doing several different trails list separately with each use (example: walking trail or bike trail).

SUPPORT FACILITIES AND IMPROVEMENTS: Support facilities are facilities which cannot stand alone, or which would have little or no public outdoor recreational value without the primary facility. No enclosed structures are eligible except restrooms, bathhouses or restroom/concession stands. Other support examples are parking, landscaping, and security lighting. Amenities such as benches, or bike racks will receive no points when being scored. The enclosed structures listed above cannot be phased and must be completed with one grant.










