## Annual Report FY 2022-23



The Land Management Uniform Accounting Council (LMUAC) member agencies manage state-owned conservation and recreation lands for the use and benefit of Florida's citizens and visitors by protecting and conserving land, air, water and natural resources, as well as ensuring the survival of native plant and animal species. LMUAC agencies collaborate to manage lands on behalf of the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund. Section 259.037 (2016) of the Florida Statutes mandates an annual report detailing costs and other information relevant to land management.

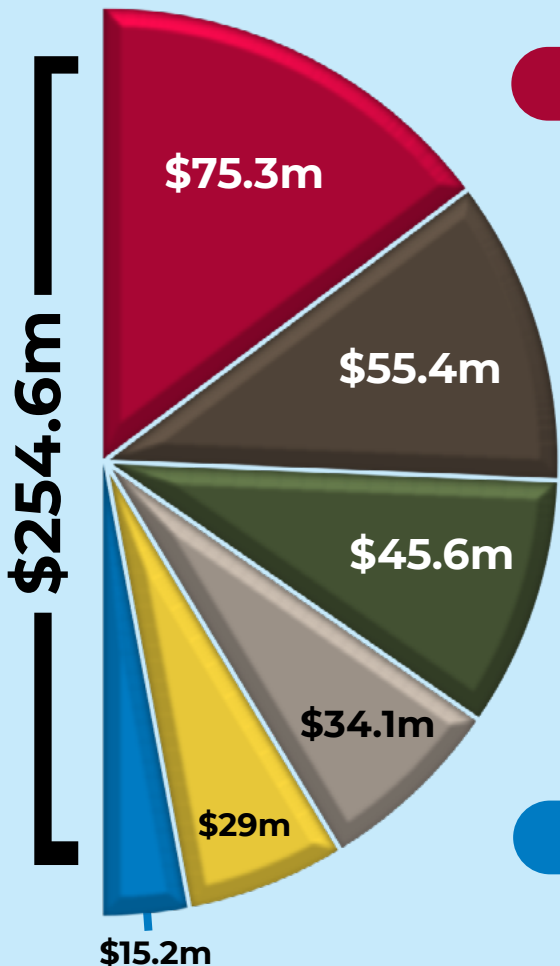

## — Land Management Cost Categories —



### 30% - Visitor Services

Operations required to provide safe, public access, and informational/educational programs

### 22% - Capital Improvements

New facility construction and maintenance

### 18% - Resource Management

Exotic species control, prescribed burning, cultural resource management, timber management, hydrological management

### 13% - Administration

HQ and Offices, districts/regions, units/projects

### 11% - Support

Land management planning and reviews, training and staff development, vehicle purchases and maintenance

### 6% - Law Enforcement
