### **Adaptation Strategies**



Defensive measures that decrease vulnerability yet allow location dependent uses to remain in place with a barrier

#### **Examples**

Shoreline Armoring

Beach Renourishment

Accommodation

Design alterations for location dependent uses that can be changed to accommodate sea level rise without interfering with use

#### **Examples**

- Structure Elevation
- Stormwater Improvements

#### Managed Retreat

The guiding of future development, and possible relocation of existing developments to less vulnerable areas

#### Examples

- Strategic Investments
- Rolling Easements
- Transfer of Development Rights

### **Competitive Business Environment**

Hazard mitigation projects that focus specifically on reducing business interruption have the largest return on investment.






### **Competitive Business Environment**



Total Ocean Tourism Contribution to Gross Regional Product, 2011





Total Recreation Contribution to Gross Regional Product, 2011








Total Seaports/Ocean Transportation Contribution to Gross Regional Product, 2011






#### Marine Industry

**Total Marine Industry Contribution to Gross Regional Product, 2011** 




