Project Description: The Florida National Scenic Trail (FNST) is a federally-designated, non-motorized, recreation trail which meanders approximately 1,300 miles across Florida. The FNST represents the diverse scenic, historic, natural and cultural character of the Florida landscape. As a National Scenic Trail, the FNST provides readily available, safe, educational, and memorable opportunities across a spectrum of challenges. The USDA Forest Service ensures the development, maintenance and promotion of the FNST through partnerships to serve both the resource and a broad base of recreationists who will enjoy, appreciate and steward this natural resource and the Nation's heritage along the FNST.

The FNST closely follows the historic Suwannee River through a heavily timbered section of Camp land in Hamilton County Florida. Complete with elevation changes, regenerated hardwoods and river bottoms, this area epitomizes the wilderness that was the original North Florida. The Camp family welcomes this opportunity to showcase their stewardship of this beautiful property to all hikers and recreationists on the FNST.

Public Access: The USDA Forest Service, National Forests in Florida, as administrator of the FNST is dedicated to ensuring recreationists can expect signage, maintenance, accessibility, and interpretation to be standardized and to meet best management practices.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING Between The CAMP ET. AL., LTD & SARA CAMP ABEL FAMILY LIMITED PARTNERSHIP And The USDA, FOREST SERVICE NATIONAL FORESTS IN FLORIDA

This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) is hereby made and entered into by and between The Camp ET. AL., LTD. & Sara Camp Abel Family Limited Partnership, hereinafter referred to as "Private Land Owner," and the USDA, Forest Service, National Forests in Florida, hereinafter referred to as the "U.S. Forest Service."

<u>Background</u>: The Florida National Scenic Trail was designated by Congress as part of the National Trails System in 1983 by amendment to the 1968 National Trails System Act. In this amendment the U.S. Forest Service, and later the National Forests in Florida, was delegated authority to build, maintain, manage and protect the Florida National Scenic Trail. The FNST is a complex and unique resource in that it traverses the lands of nearly 30 different federal, state, public and private interests and is supported by a myriad of public and private interest and user groups. The National Trails System Act states:

"(7) (h) (1)... When deemed to be in the public interest such Secretary may enter written cooperative agreements with States or their political subdivisions, landowners, private organizations, or individuals to operate, develop, and maintain any portion of such a trail... (and) may include provisions... to encourage participation in the acquisition, protection, operation, development and maintenance of such trails..."

Title: Florida National Scenic Trail Certification Agreement on Private Lands

I. PURPOSE: The purpose of this MOU is to document the cooperation between the parties to cooperatively locate the Florida National Scenic Trail on The Camp ET. AL., LTD. & Sara Camp Abel Family Limited Partnership lands in accordance with the following provisions.

II. STATEMENT OF MUTUAL BENEFIT AND INTERESTS:

The Florida National Scenic Trail is a federally-designated, non-motorized, recreation trail that represents the diverse scenic, historic, natural and cultural character of the Florida landscape. As a National Scenic Trail, the FNST provides readily available, safe, educational, and memorable opportunities across a spectrum of challenges; recreationists can expect signage, maintenance, accessibility, and interpretation to be standardized and to meet best management practices; and



recreationists recognize and identify their trail experience as part of the larger, distinct National Scenic Trail experience.

The U.S. Forest Service, National Forests in Florida, as administrator of the FNST is dedicated to ensuring the development, maintenance and promotion of the Trail through partnerships to serve both the resource and a broad base of recreationists who will enjoy, appreciate and steward this natural resource and the Nation's heritage along the FNST.

The Camp family has been involved for over 100 years in all aspects of the forestry business throughout Hamilton County.

The Florida National Scenic Trail closely follows the historic Suwannee River through a heavily timbered section of Camp land. Complete with elevation changes, regenerated hardwoods and river bottoms, this area epitomizes the wilderness that was the original North Florida.

The Camp family welcomes this opportunity to showcase their stewardship of this beautiful property to all hikers and recreationists.

In consideration of the above premises, the parties agree as follows:

III. PRIVATE LAND OWNER SHALL:

- A. Allow public pedestrian access to the designated route of the Florida National Scenic Trail.
- B. Allow Florida National Scenic Trail staff and volunteers access to the trail for the purposes of trail management.
- C. Provide advanced notice to the U.S. Forest Service if the trail is to be temporarily closed or relocated.
- D. Notify the U.S. Forest Service, Florida National Scenic Trail Program Manager, of any issues or concerns related to the trail or trail use, especially when communicating with trail users or the public.

IV. THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE SHALL:

- A. Serve as managers for the Florida National Scenic Trail.
- B. Provide workmen's compensation and tort liability coverage to volunteers maintaining the Florida National Scenic Trail who are operating under a Sponsored Volunteer Agreement, to include the Florida Trail Association.



C. Manage the Florida National Scenic Trail to the appropriate trail standards by Trail Class 1 – 5. See Attachment 1.

V. IT IS MUTUALLY UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT:

- A. The Florida National Scenic Trail will be cooperatively located in order to provide a user experience appropriate for a National Scenic Trail and connectivity to existing segments of trail. See Attachment 2.
- B. A supporting application for designation as part of the Florida Greenways and Trails System will be completed by both parties as Consenting Land Owner and Trail Manager which will qualify the Private Land Owner for liability protection for allowing public access.
- C. The Florida Trail Association is recognized as a contributing partner in the development, maintenance and promotion of the FNST and is currently operating under a Sponsored Volunteer Agreement with the U.S. Forest Service.

Any communications affecting the operations covered by this agreement given by the U.S. Forest Service or the Private Land Owner is sufficient only if in writing and delivered in person, mailed, or transmitted electronically by e-mail or fax, as follows:



To the U.S. Forest Service Program Manager, at the address specified in the MOU.

To the Private Land Owner, at the Private Land Owner's address shown in the MOU or such other address designated within the MOU.

Notices are effective when delivered in accordance with this provision, or on the effective date of the notice, whichever is later.

- F. <u>PARTICIPATION IN SIMILAR ACTIVITIES</u>. This MOU in no way restricts the U.S. Forest Service or the Private Land Owner from participating in similar activities with other public or private agencies, organizations, and individuals.
- G. <u>ENDORSEMENT</u>. Any of the Private Land Owners contributions made under this MOU do not by direct reference or implication convey U.S. Forest Service endorsement of **Error! Reference source not found.**'s products or activities.
- H. <u>NONBINDING AGREEMENT</u>. This MOU creates no right, benefit, or trust responsibility, substantive or procedural, enforceable by law or equity. The parties shall manage their respective resources and activities in a separate, coordinated and mutually beneficial manner to meet the purpose(s) of this MOU. Nothing in this MOU authorizes any of the parties to obligate or transfer anything of value.

Specific, prospective projects or activities that involve the transfer of funds, services, property, and/or anything of value to a party requires the execution of separate agreements and are contingent upon numerous factors, including, as applicable, but not limited to: agency availability of appropriated funds and other resources; cooperator availability of funds and other resources; agency and cooperator administrative and legal requirements (including agency authorization by statute); etc. This MOU neither provides, nor meets these criteria. If the parties elect to enter into an obligation agreement that involves the transfer of funds, services, property, and/or anything of value to a party, then the applicable criteria must be met. Additionally, under a prospective agreement, each party operates under its own laws, regulations, and/or policies, and any Forest Service obligation is subject to the availability of appropriated funds and other resources. The negotiation, execution, and administration of these prospective agreements must comply with all applicable laws

Nothing in this MOU is intended to alter, limit, or expand the agencies' statutory and regulatory authority.

I. <u>USE OF U.S. FOREST SERVICE INSIGNIA</u>. In order for the Private Land Owner to use the U.S. Forest Service insignia on any published media, such as a Web page, printed publication, or audiovisual production, permission must be



granted from the U.S. Forest Service's Office of Communications. A written request must be submitted and approval granted in writing by the Office of Communications (Washington Office) prior to use of the insignia.

- J. <u>MEMBERS OF U.S. CONGRESS</u>. Pursuant to 41 U.S.C. 22, no U.S. member of, or U.S. delegate to, Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of this agreement, or benefits that may arise therefrom, either directly or indirectly.
- K. <u>FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT (FOIA)</u>. Public access to MOU or agreement records must not be limited, except when such records must be kept confidential and would have been exempted from disclosure pursuant to Freedom of Information regulations (5 U.S.C. 552).
- L. <u>TERMINATION</u>. Any of the parties, in writing, may terminate this MOU in whole, or in part, at any time before the date of expiration.
- M. <u>DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION</u>. The Private Landowner shall immediately inform the U.S. Forest Service if they or any of their principals are presently excluded, debarred, or suspended from entering into covered transactions with the federal government according to the terms of 2 CFR Part 180. Additionally, should the Private Landowner or any of their principals receive a transmittal letter or other official Federal notice of debarment or suspension, then they shall notify the U.S. Forest Service without undue delay. This applies whether the exclusion, debarment, or suspension is voluntary or involuntary.
- N. <u>MODIFICATIONS</u>. Modifications within the scope of this MOU must be made by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written modification signed and dated by all properly authorized, signatory officials, prior to any changes being performed. Requests for modification should be made, in writing, at least 30 days prior to implementation of the requested change.
- O. <u>COMMENCEMENT/EXPIRATION DATE</u>. This MOU is executed as of the date of the last signature and is effective through 5 years from that date at which time it will expire. A new MOU may be signed in its place.
- P. <u>AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES</u>. By signature below, each party certifies that the individuals listed in this document as representatives of the individual parties are authorized to act in their respective areas for matters related to this MOU. 
