



Parks and Open Space Program

The 2020-21 appropriation provides funding emphasis on:

- Projects in low-income or otherwise disadvantaged communities.
- Projects that provide areas for direct water access and water-dependent facilities that are open to the public and offer public access by vessels to waters of the state, including boat ramps and associated parking and other support facilities.
- Also emphasized is the acquisition of lands for recreational trail systems.

Limit on Grant Awards

Each applicant may only apply for up to \$5 million, regardless of the number of applications.





Project Site Selection



Things to Consider:

- > Pre-acquisition of project site.
- > Fewer parcels are better.
- > Choose a site that has multiple attributes, including potential for providing accessibility and recreation.
- > Awareness of **revenue restrictions**:
 - > Only minor revenue generation allowed.
 - > Any revenue generated on a project must be used for maintenance of that site.



Project Site Selection



Things to Avoid:

- Eminent domain, condemnation or threat of condemnation.
- Project sites with serious environmental contamination.
- Project sites that contain non-contiguous parcels.
- Billboards; cell phone towers.
- Large-scale revenue generating activities.



Notice of Eligibility Status



Purpose is to verify submission of:

- Application Form FCT-5
- One application per project site
- Award limits and match requirements
- Appropriate activities on the project site
- Eligible applicant
- Timeliness (submitted by deadline)

Contiguous Project Site

Project sites with more than one parcel are required to be contiguous, or contiguous through public ownership.

Exceptions:

- Part of an adopted local government beach boardwalk or Riverwalk plan within 1 mile of each other.
- Part of a Listed Species Protection Plan within 2 miles of each other.
- Part of a Riverine Corridor Protection Plan within 5 miles of each other.

Contiguous adj. next (to); touching, in contact.

See also: contiguity, contiguously.



Transmittal Letter

Must accompany the application:

- On Official letterhead.
- Designate a Key Contact.
- Address and driving directions to site.
- Include a statement binding applicant to fulfill commitments made in application. Include a statement that condemnation or threat of condemnation was not used.
- FEID #
- Mailing Address for Reimbursement same as in MFMP
- Signed by City/County Manager or Assistant Manager or non-profit Executive Director.

Partnership Applications require a letter from all partners.

 - FCT Governing Board ranks and selects projects based on presentations and discussion.
- After selection, FCT staff will conduct site visits to confirm project scores.
- FCT Governing Board approves Final Notice of Project Approval and Funding at public meeting.
