Dear Mr. Claridge:

Thank you for Florida Department of Environmental Protection's June 2, 2017 request that changes to Chapters 161, 163, 252, 253, 259, 334, 339, 373, 376, 379, 380, 403, 553, 582 and 597 of the Florida Statutes be incorporated into the Florida Coastal Management Program (FL CMP). You requested that the changes described below be incorporated as routine program changes (RPCs), pursuant to Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA) regulations at 15 C.F.R. part 923, subpart H, and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's (NOAA's) Office for Coastal Management's *Program Change Guidance (July 1996)*. The Office for Coastal Management's decision deadline for the request received on June 2, 2017 was extended to September 22, 2017.

The Office for Coastal Management received no comments on this RPC submission. Based on our review of your submission, we concur, with the exceptions described below, that the changes are RPCs and we approve the incorporation of the changes as enforceable and non-enforceable policies of the Florida Coastal Management Program. Any changes to enforceable policies of the FL CMP only can be applied for CZMA review purposes after notice of this approval is published pursuant to 15 C.F.R. § 923.84(b)(4) and the Office for Coastal Management's *Addendum to the July 1996 Program Change Guidance (November 2013)*. Please include in the public notice the list of or an electronic address for viewing the changes to the program, and provide a copy of the notice to the Office for Coastal Management.

### **CHANGES APPROVED**

### **ENFORCEABLE POLICIES OF THE FLORIDA CMP**

In 2014, Office for Coastal Management and FL CMP staff discussed the need for a comprehensive identification of enforceable policies within the FL CMP. Over the years of reviewing the state's annual submission of program changes, there has been much disagreement over which policies were identified as enforceable for CZMA review purposes. Numerous policies were identified as enforceable policies that OCM found not to meet the requirements for

enforceable policies. Policies were found to contain no standard that could be applied to determine whether an activity was consistent with those policies.

Although the state was required to identify enforceable policies in program change submissions, the determination of whether the program changes were approvable as enforceable policies did not resolve the question of whether the remaining sections of each chapter within the Florida Statutes were enforceable policies. In an effort to resolve those questions, the Office for Coastal Management and the FL CMP agreed that the FL CMP would submit several chapters of the Florida Statutes annually in their entirety for review to determine whether the policies within the chapters were enforceable. *See* Letter from Joelle Gore, OCM, to Kelly Samek, FL CMP, (June 18, 2014). These submissions were to be made regardless of whether there had been program changes to the chapters. Over the span of several years, all of the chapters of the Florida Statutes will have been reviewed to identify the enforceable policies within them for CZMA review purposes. In the meantime, the state will continue to submit all legislative changes on an annual basis but the Office for Coastal Management agreed to not question the enforceability of policies that are modified by the state legislature until those chapters are brought before the Office for Coastal Management for review in their entirety.

This multi-year effort is being conducted in conjunction with the program change process; however, the determination of the enforceability of policies within the FL CMP is not a program change. It is merely a determination as to whether the policies within the program meet the requirements enforceable policies used for CZMA Federal Consistency review purposes.

In order to keep the determination of enforceable policies current, if program changes are to chapters which have been previously reviewed in their entirety to determine the enforceable policies within them, those changes will be reviewed to determine if the sections as changed are enforceable policies for CZMA review purposes.

Putting aside the question of whether a program change is an enforceable policy is not a confirmation that a policy is such or remains as such until the Office for Coastal Management determines that it is not. The Office for Coastal Management is simply deferring the resolution of the question. If any section of the Florida Statutes is applied as an enforceable policy and that application is challenged, and if the section is found not to meet the requirements for enforceable policies, the Office for Coastal Management will not support the state in its application of the policy.

In previous years, the Office for Coastal Management has reviewed the following chapters in their entirety to determine the enforceable policies within them: 161, 258 and 260 (2015); and 259, 334 and 339 (2016).

This year, the state has submitted the enforceable policies of chapters 267 and 597 for review. The Office for Coastal Management has found that the chapter sections identified by the state as enforceable policies at pages 87 and 475 of the submission qualify as such with the exceptions of sections are 267.031, 267.135, 597.002 and 597.020. The state has asked that these policies be withdrawn from a final determination as to their enforceability so that the state may consult with

agency partners responsible for administering those sections, with the option of resubmitting them in 2018.

The state withdrew several sections from the review last year after it was determined by the Office for Coastal Management that the sections did not qualify as enforceable policies. The state requested that it be able to resubmit those sections after consultation with the state agencies which administered those statutes. Several sections were resubmitted as enforceable policies as part of this program change submission. In this review and discussions with the FL CMP, the enforceability of the previously submitted chapters and sections has been determined and agreed upon as shown in the separate table of enforceable policies of the FL CMP with the exceptions of sections 259.04, 259.06, and 339.175. The state has asked that these policies be withdrawn from a final determination as to their enforceability so that the state may consult with its agency partners responsible for administering those sections, with the option of resubmitting them in 2018.

### **STANDARD QUALIFICATION**

As a standard qualification placed on all program change approvals, it is noted that states may not incorporate enforceable policies by reference. If an approved enforceable policy refers to another statute, regulation, policy, standard, guidance, or other such requirement or document, the referenced policy itself must be submitted to and approved by the Office for Coastal Management as an enforceable policy in order to be applied under the federal consistency review provisions of the CZMA. Therefore, no referenced policy in these approved enforceable policies may be applied for federal consistency unless that referenced policy has been separately approved by the Office for Coastal Management.
