Thank you for the June 1, 2020 request for approval of changes to the Florida Coastal Management Program pursuant to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA) regulations at 15 CFR part 923, subpart H.¹

With the clarifications, exceptions, and qualifications noted below, the Office for Coastal Management approves the incorporation of the changes as part of the federally approved Florida Coastal Management Program. Please note that a public notice by the state of this decision is required under 15 CFR § 923.81(e)(5). Please include in the public notice the Table of Approved Changes provided with this letter, or a link thereto, and send a copy of the notice to the Office for Coastal Management for our records.

PUBLIC AND FEDERAL AGENCY COMMENTS

The Office for Coastal Management did not receive any comments on this program change submission.

CLARIFICATIONS, EXCEPTIONS, AND QUALIFICATIONS

The submission by the state includes the request for approval of Section 379.2231 F.S. as an enforceable policy of the Florida Coastal Management Program. Section 379.2231 F.S. pertains to penalty assessments for violations of statutes in Chapter 379, F.S. Although Section 379.2231 F.S. is a mechanism to enforce the standards of Chapter 379, the section does not contain a

standard by which the determination of the consistency of a federal action with the section could be made. Under 15 CFR § 930.84(b)(2) of the CZMA Program Change regulations, enforceable policies to be used for CZMA review purposes must contain standards of sufficient specificity to guide public and private uses. Without a standard to determine consistency, the section is not approvable as an enforceable policy for CZMA review purposes. Although the section cannot be used in the CZMA review of federal actions, the NOAA Office for Coastal Management recognizes that Section 379.2231 serves other purposes in the state's management of coastal uses and resources and approves its incorporation into the Florida Coastal Management Program.

The state notes that other penalties associated with violations in Chapter 379, F.S., are already included as enforceable policies in previous submissions, and the FCMP asks for the inclusion of this section to remain consistent with this interpretation. As recognized in the preamble to the Final Rule for the 2019 revisions to the CZMA Program Change regulations, NOAA has previously approved statutes and regulations as enforceable policies for CZMA review purposes that did not contain sufficient standards to guide public and private uses. Nonetheless, without a standard, there is no way to determine whether an activity is consistent with the policy, and the policy would not be applicable for CZMA review purposes regardless of its approval by NOAA.²

As a standard qualification applying to all program changes, states may not incorporate enforceable policies by reference. If an approved enforceable policy refers to another statute, regulation, policy, standard, guidance, or other such requirement or document, the referenced policy must be submitted to and approved by the Office for Coastal Management as an enforceable policy in order to be applied under the federal consistency review provisions of the CZMA. No referenced policy may be applied for CZMA federal consistency review purposes unless that policy has been separately reviewed and approved as an enforceable policy by the Office for Coastal Management.
