

Thank you for the August 15, 2024 request for approval of changes to the Florida Coastal Management Program pursuant to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA) regulations at 15 CFR part 923, subpart H.¹

NOAA's Office for Coastal Management approves the request subject to the qualification below.
