Our mission is to support program funding, environmental education, stewardship of natural and cultural resources, scientific research, and all other endeavors of the Apalachicola National Estuarine Research Reserve.

# Reserve Program Support

### Education

The Friends of the Reserve supported TOTE (Teachers on the Estuary), an in-service program in which teachers from the area engage in activities and training to help them better incorporate estuarine and marine science into their teaching. FOR purchased monogrammed backpacks and binoculars for use by the education department on field trips with local student to enable them to get closer to nature. The backpacks will be used for explorer kits that can be checked out from the Nature Center by guests to be used on the Reserve boardwalks and grounds.

### • Sea Turtle Conservation

FOR continued to support the Saint George Island Sea Turtle conservation program. T-shirts were purchased for the 25+ volunteers who identify and monitor nests daily. A \$1000 donation was received from the St. George Island Civic Club towards the purchase of rain jackets for the turtle volunteers. FOR provided the remaining funds needed to purchase the jackets. Postcards and postage were purchased that were mailed out to all homeowners on St. George Island to educate

owners and their renters about how to protect sea turtle hatchlings. One turtle intern was paid a monthly stipend of \$1000 by FOR. In addition, an assistant turtle volunteer coordinator was paid a \$600 monthly stipend. The turtle intern was housed in the Reserve dorms. FOR provided appliances and household items as needed. Adopt-a-Nest continued to be managed through FOR. Adoption certificates, nest photos, and custom stickers were mailed to adopters.

### > Events

# Estuaries Day

Scheduled for the first Friday in May each year, FOR provided funding for snacks and supplies and were the fiscal manager for grant proceeds from the Tourist Development Council and other sponsors for Estuaries Day t-shirts and promotional materials and signage. In addition, FOR paid for off-duty deputies to provide traffic control. At this event, the public was invited to learn about and participate in a wide variety of estuary-related activities. The event was attended by over 700 individuals. Many friends' members as well as board members volunteered at this event.

# Volunteer Appreciation Event

Volunteers are crucial to the work of the Reserve as well as the operation of the Friends' store in the Nature Center. FOR hosted a volunteer appreciation event providing a delicious meal. Nature center store gift certificates were given to the volunteers.

### Plein Air

Members of the Friends of the Reserve (FOR) Board and the Board of the Forgotten Coast Plein Air (FCPA) art event have been working to try and bring the two organizations together for several years. This year, it finally happened with the FCPA group working alongside staff of ANERR hosting demonstrations, exhibits, and a reception for the plein air artists. The event was well attended by the public.

# Fundraising

#### Nature Center Store

The Nature Center store remains the primary fundraising activity for the Friends of the Reserve. An area to promote the work of FOR and announce events at the Reserve has been developed this year with a new brochure and an interactive digital presentation.

# Memberships and Donations

Memberships and donations were solicited through letters, emails, brochures in the nature center, and via the website. PayPal continues to be available as a means of payment. Constant Contact was utilized for email automation to maintain better contact with members and to send out the quarterly newsletter, The Oystercatcher, published by the Reserve.

### Other Activities

### ANERR Requests

Throughout the year, FOR provided funds for a wide variety of manager-approved requests from the staff at ANERR that allows the Reserve to continue its work in research, education, training, and stewardship unfettered by fiscal constraints.

# Investments

The Friends will continue to maintain an investment account with Fidelity Investments utilizing reserve funds not needed for regular monetary activities. These funds will primarily be invested in short maturity U.S. Treasury bills.

# Describe the CSO's Plans for the Next Three Calendar Years:

### Education

FOR will continue support of the Teachers on the Estuary program as well as school field trips. A student graduating in 2026 has already been chosen to begin the work required to receive the \$2000 scholarship. In addition, support

will be provided for large events hosted by the Education Department such as Estuaries Day and An Afternoon with Monarchs.

### Sea Turtle Conservation

Sea turtle conservation will remain an important endeavor for the Friends of the Reserve. Support will be provided for stipends for interns. t-shirts and jackets for volunteers, and other supplies as needed to secure and protect turtle nests. New signage and other educational materials will be purchased as needed. Management of the Adopta-Nest program will continue with the intent to find new and better ways to educate the public and better protect the hatchlings.

# Volunteer Program

FOR will continue to host a volunteer appreciation event and provide gift certificates to the Nature Center Store to volunteers who give a significant amount of time to efforts at the Reserve. FOR will also work with the Reserve Volunteer Coordinator to secure more volunteers to support the work of the Reserve. Plans for exciting new volunteer appreciation events will be considered, such as trips to Little Saint George Island. For will continue to support Level II background screening of volunteers by paying for fingerprinting.

# **ANERR Requests**

FOR will as always fulfill requests made by the ANERR staff and management that allows the Reserve to continue its work in research, education, training, and stewardship unfettered by fiscal constraints. With the uncertainty of federal funding, the scope of this goal may change drastically in the next year.

# **Fundraising efforts**

The Nature Center store will continue to be the main fundraising effort of the Friends of the Reserve. Improvements to store inventory with more diversity will be a goal for the coming year. Communication with members through membership letters, presentations, and the quarterly newsletter will continue. A new brochure as well as an upgraded Friends area in the Nature Center will hopefully increase memberships, donations, and turtle adoptions. FOR will maintain and appropriately manage an investment account to have funds available outside the normal operating budget for needs that may arise at the Reserve.

The Reserve manager continues to have a strong relationship with the Board and the Executive Director of the Friends. Communication is happening at least on a weekly basis and frequently more often. The manager attends board meetings every other month and the board will do poll by email if needed between meetings.

The Friends continue to support the Apalachicola Reserve website, where most of the public connect to the Reserve. There are several publications found there including maps of managed areas, the Roadmap to Recreation, the quarterly Oystercatcher newsletter, and more information about the programs. The website is also a repository for educational videos, Symposium recordings and Sci Café presentations. In addition, the president of the Friends contributes regular posts to the Friends Facebook page, which is also used as a marketing tool for the Training Program's Stewardship Series.

The Friends continue to support the Sea Turtle Adopt-a-Nest program which has made significant progress over the last year resulting in 119 adopted nests before turtles even hit the beach. Outreach efforts have been improved as well as efforts to follow up with donors. The most important outcome of the Adopt-a-Nest program from the Reserve's perspective, is the funding supports two interns through the summer that assist the nest monitoring on Little St. George Island and research programs.

The Friends continue to support various events at the Reserve and serve as fiscal agents for grants and other pass-through monies. They provide snacks and supplies for Estuaries Day and serve as the fiscal managers for grant proceeds from the Tourist Development Council and other sponsors for t-shirts, promotional materials, and signage. Many friends' members as well as board members volunteered at this event that was attended by 735 people this year.

Volunteers are crucial to the work at the Reserve as well as the operation of the Nature Center. The Friends along with the Reserve's Volunteer Coordinator planned an appreciation event and provided funding for food. Nature Center gift certificates were also provided to the volunteers.

The Friends continue to support the Reserve through the Nature Center store, which is the primary fundraising activity. Memberships and donations are solicited through letters, emails, brochures in the nature center and on the website.

The Friends provide valuable support to the Reserve by extending our capacity, actively raising funds through memberships, donations and grants, and by helping to build a sense of community stewardship through events and social media posts that enhance public support for resource protection. The Friends continue to support the Reserve programs in many ways and we are very grateful to them for their willingness to consider supporting new initiatives at the Reserve.

# **CODE OF ETHICS**

# **PREAMBLE**

- (1) It is essential to the proper conduct and operation of Friends of the Reserve, Inc. (herein "CSO") that its board members, officers, and employees be independent and impartial and that their position not be used for private gain. Therefore, the Florida Legislature in Section 112.3251, Florida Statute (Fla. Stat.), requires that the law protect against any conflict of interest and establish standards for the conduct of CSO board members, officers, and employees in situations where conflicts may exist.
- (2) It is hereby declared to be the policy of the state that no CSO board member, officer, or employee shall have any interest, financial or otherwise, direct or indirect, or incur any obligation of any nature which is in substantial conflict with the proper discharge of his or her duties for the CSO. To implement this policy and strengthen the faith and confidence of the people in Citizen Support Organizations, there is enacted a code of ethics setting forth standards of conduct required of Friends of the Reserve, Inc. board members, officers, and employees in the performance of their official duties.

# **STANDARDS**

The following standards of conduct are enumerated in Chapter 112, Fla. Stat., and are required by Section 112.3251, Fla. Stat., to be observed by CSO board members, officers, and employees.

# 1. Prohibition of Solicitation or Acceptance of Gifts

No CSO board member, officer, or employee shall solicit or accept anything of value to the recipient, including a gift, loan, reward, promise of future employment, favor, or service, based upon any understanding that the vote, official action, or judgment of the CSO board member, officer, or employee would be influenced thereby.

# 2. Prohibition of Accepting Compensation Given to Influence a Vote

No CSO board member, officer, or employee shall accept any compensation, payment, or thing of value when the person knows, or, with reasonable care, should know that it was given to influence a vote or other action in which the CSO board member, officer, or employee was expected to participate in his or her official capacity.

# 3. Salary and Expenses

No CSO board member or officer shall be prohibited from voting on a matter affecting his or her salary, expenses, or other compensation as a CSO board member or officer, as provided by law.

# 1. Prohibition of Misuse of Position

A CSO board member, officer, or employee shall not corruptly use or attempt to use one's official position or any property or resource which may be within one's trust, or perform official duties, to secure a special privilege, benefit, or exemption.

# 2. Prohibition of Misuse of Privileged Information

No CSO board member, officer, or employee shall disclose or use information not available to members of the general public and gained by reason of one's official position for one's own personal gain or benefit or for the personal gain or benefit of any other person or business entity.

# 3. Post-Office/Employment Restrictions

A person who has been elected to any CSO board or office or who is employed by a CSO may not personally represent another person or entity for compensation before the governing body of the CSO of which he or she was a board member, officer, or employee for a period of two years after he or she vacates that office or employment position.

# 4. Prohibition of Employees Holding Office

No person may be, at one time, both a CSO employee and a CSO board member at the same time.

# 5. Requirements to Abstain From Voting

A CSO board member or officer shall not vote in official capacity upon any measure which would affect his or her special private gain or loss, or which he or she knows would affect the special gain or any principal by whom the board member or officer is retained. When abstaining, the CSO board member or officer, prior to the vote being taken, shall make every reasonable effort to disclose the nature of his or her interest as a public record in a memorandum filed with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting, who shall incorporate the memorandum in the minutes. If it is not possible for the CSO board member or officer to file a memorandum before the vote, the memorandum must be filed with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting no later than 15 days after the vote.

# 6. Failure to Observe CSO Code of Ethics

Failure of a CSO board member, officer, or employee may result in the removal of that person from their position. Further, failure of the CSO to observe the Code of Ethics may result in the Florida Department of Environmental Protection terminating its Agreement with the CSO.
