Natural Resources

The park contains 7 distinct natural communities:

- Mangrove Swamp
- Maritime Hammock
- Costal Strand
- Beach Dune





Natural Resources

Fort Pierce Inlet State Park protects and provides habitat for 8 imperiled plants and 6 imperiled animals including:

- Johnson's seagrass
- Beach star
- Leatherback turtle
- Roseate spoonbill





Natural Resources

6 exotic plant species listed by the Florida Exotic Pest Plant Council have been observed at the park including:

- Australian Pine
- Castor Bean
- Brazilian Pepper



Resource Management



Resource Management Objectives

Natural Communities Management

• Assess the need for fire within spoil areas

Hydrological Management

- Improve water quality and wildlife habitat within Tucker Cove
- Conduct assessment of parks mangrove swamps within the mosquito impoundments

Imperiled Species Management

- Monitor and document 5 imperiled animal species
- Monitor and document 1 imperiled plant species



Resource Management Objectives

Exotic Species Management

• Annually treat 50 acres of exotics plants in the park

Cultural Resource Management

- Assess and evaluate all recorded cultural resources in park
- Record structures as they become historic



Conceptual Land Use Plan

The objective in park planning is to achieve a balance between preserving natural conditions and providing public access for recreation purposes.
