### FCT STAFF ASSIGNMENTS



Your primary contact for the Parks and Open Space Florida Forever grant program will be the FCT staff member assigned to the county your project is located in.



### PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- Land acquisition program established in 1989
- Typical projects include parks, open spaces, and greenways
- Governed by Rules 62-818 & 62-819, F.A.C.
- FCT currently manages over 600 project sites and protects nearly 100,000 acres
- Funding is appropriated via the Florida Legislature





### FY2023-2024 FUNDING AVAILABLE

### **Cycle-specific particulars:**

- \$15 million available in funding
- The application cycle window opens on October 10, 2023, and runs through January 10, 2024.
- 5 p.m. (ET) on Wednesday, January 10, 2024, is the deadline for an applicant to apply.
- No applications received after 5 PM (EST) on that day will be accepted.



### **ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS**

Per Rule 62-818.003(4), F.A.C., eligible applicants for the Parks and Open Space grant program are limited to:

- Local governments
- Nonprofit Environmental Organizations; and
- Partnerships (a combination of one or both parties above)



### **INELIGIBLE APPLICANTS**

In addition to defining eligible applicants, Rule 62-818.003 also lists factors that would render an otherwise eligible applicant ineligible. These factors include:


- An inability to guarantee public access to the site
- If the applicant has three (3) or more active Grant Agreements with the Florida Communities Trust at the time of the project selection meeting
- If the applicant has an overdue stewardship report



## LIMIT ON GRANT AWARDS


Rule 62-818.003(7), F.A.C., discusses the limitations of our grant funding. These limits include:

- Each applicant may only apply for up to \$5 million
- If one applicant submits multiple applications, the total award amount requested may not exceed \$5 million

### WHAT IS A PROJECT SITE?

Per Rule 62-818.002(35), a "Project Site" is:

"the specific areas(s), defined by a boundary map or legal description and Certified Survey, where Trust funds are proposed in an Application to be used for all or a portion of the Acquisition."



### WHAT MAKES A PROJECT CONTIGUOUS?

Project sites with more than one parcel are required to be contiguous, or contiguous through public ownership.

Non-contiguous parcels must be located within:

- One (1) mile of each other if contained within a riverwalk or beach boardwalk.
- Two (2) miles of each other if contained within a listed species habitat protection plan.
- Five (5) miles of each other if contained within a rivervine corridor protection plan.

Contiguous adj. next (to); touching, in contact. See also: contiguity, contiguously.



## DETERMINING A SUITABLE PROJECT

# Factors that can simplify our process and increase the likelihood of awarding grant funding:

- >Pre-acquired sites, due diligence is available at time of submission
- > Fewer parcels simplify the acquisition process for both parties
- >Sites with multiple attributes, (ex. Access to shoreline, multiple recreation facilities, archaeological important, etc.)
- >Previously or easily-established public access

### Awareness of revenue restrictions:

- >Only minor revenue generation allowed.
- Any revenue generated on a project must be used for maintenance of that site.



### PROJECT SITE SELECTION

### Things to Avoid:

- Eminent domain, condemnation or threat of condemnation.
- Project sites with serious environmental contamination.
- Project sites that contain non-contiguous parcels.
- Billboards; cell phone towers.
- Large-scale revenue generating activities.



### APPLICATION PACKAGE

### **Every Application Package MUST Include:**

- A Transmittal Letter
- One original Application Form FCT-5
- All accompanying exhibits and backup documents
  - To be tabbed and labeled as per the Application Guide



### TRANSMITTAL LETTER

Per Rule 62-818.004(3), applications must be transmitted with a cover letter, hereby referred to as

the "transmittal letter." This letter must include:

- Official letterhead
- Designation of a key contact
- Address and driving directions to the site
- Inclusion of a statement binding applicant to fulfill commitments made in the application
- Inclusion of a statement that condemnation or threat of condemnation was not or will not be used
- Federal Employer Identification Number (FEID)
- Mailing Address for Reimbursement same as in MyFlorida Marketplace (MFMP).
- Original signature by City/County Manager or Assistant Manager or non-profit Executive Director.

Partnership Applications require a letter from all partners, or one letter with original signatures from each respective representative.
