Amphitheater	Outdoor space surrounded by seating rising in curved rows that is used for interpretive programming and special events; may or may not be roofed.
Bar-B-Q Shelter	A roofed cooking area with a built-in BBQ pit.
Bathhouse	Facility which includes showers, toilets and sinks; usually in campgrounds but can also be in swimming areas. Some contain only changing areas, but no showers.
Beach	Saltwater areas of open sandy shoreline fronting the Atlantic Ocean, Straits of Florida, and the Gulf of Mexico.
Biking Trail	Trail designated for only riding a bicycle. Can be paved or unpaved.
Biking/Equestrian Trail	Trail designated from both biking and horseback riding. Can be paved or unpaved.
Boardwalk	Raised platform intended for non-vehicular transportation over ecologically sensitive areas.
Boat Lanes	A single paved or stabilized ramp for launching boats (boat ramp may include multiple lanes).
Boat Ramp	Improved (paved) and unimproved (sand, gravel) ramps designed for launching motorized and non-motorized boats.
Boathouse	Covered boat slip.
Cabins	A structure for overnight accommodation.
Campfire Circle	Area with an established fire ring and constructed seating around a fire ring.
Campground	A developed area to support recreational vehicles (RV), travel trailers, pop-up campers and tents. This area may include the following list of amenities: water connections, electricity connections, centralized showers, restrooms, dump station, picnic tables, campfire ring and/or grill; may also include sewer hook-ups and other amenities.
Camping Platform	Raised platform used for tent camping, may be covered or screened.
Campsite	Site within a campground dedicated for RV or tent.
Canoe/Kayak/Tube	Launch area or areas for putting canoes, kayaks or tubes in freshwater or saltwater with or without dedicated facilities.
Commemorative Site	Site, structure or monument commemorating a person, event, industry, etc.
Corral	Undivided fenced area used for containing animals.
Designated Swimming Areas	A designated area where persons can enter the water for swimming. Area is marked by buoys, floating ropes, or other marking devices, or monitored by lifeguards. May include amenities such as a restroom or picnic facilities, and is associated with beaches, bays, lakes, rivers, and springs.
Developed Group Camp	Overnight accommodation for organized groups which typically consists of primitive cabins, restrooms, dining hall, recreation hall, open-air pavilions and office/infirmary/staff quarters building. These facilities are usually rented for church retreats, family reunions, corporate retreats and youth camp programs (e.g. Wekiwa Springs, O'Leno, Hugh Taylor Birch State Parks).
Diving Platform	Stand-alone elevated structure used for diving.
Dock	A structure extending alongshore or out from the shore into a body of water, to which boats may be moored.
Dump Station	Facility specifically designed for recreational vehicle wastewater.
Electric 30 Amp	Campsite with 30 amp electrical connection.
Electric 50 Amp	Campsite with 50 amp electrical connection.
Environmental Education Center	Facility built to provide educational activities, class rooms, laboratory space, etc.

Equestrian Campground	Area designated for equestrian camping.
Equestrian Campsite	Site within an equestrian campground primarily designated for equestrian use.
Equestrian Trail	Trail designated for horseback riding only.
Family Restroom	A facility that is a one-hole unisex/family facility that is a bathroom or also a bathhouse.
Fishing Jetty	A structure of stones, piles, or the like projecting into the water with an improved surface used for fishing.
Fishing Platform	Raised platform providing access to fishable waters; differs from a pier in that it connects with the shore in multiple locations.
Fitness Trail	Trail with exercise (parcours) stations.
Florida National Scenic Trail	Portion of the park's hiking trails designated as a segment of the Florida National Scenic Trail.
Garden	Site which has been intensively landscaped, usually in a formal manner, to provide aesthetic enjoyment.
Gazebo	Roofed, decorative structure.
Golf Course	A large area of land set up for the game of golf with a series of 9 or 18 holes.
Hiking Trail	Trail designated specifically for walking distances more than one (1) mile, includes backpacking.
Hiking/Biking Trail	Trail designated from both hiking and bicycle riding. Can be paved or unpaved.
Hiking/Biking/Equestrian Trail	Trail designated from both hiking, biking, and horseback riding. Can be paved or unpaved.
Hiking/Equestrian Trail	Trail designated from both hiking and horseback riding. Can be paved or unpaved.
Historic Cabin	Historic Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) cabin available for rental (e.g. Myakka River, O'Leno, Gold Head Branch State Parks).
Historic Site	Any building, landscape, site or structure that has been preserved due to its cultural heritage value and is primarily maintained for members of the public to visit. May include original or replica structures, ruins, and landscape features (e.g. fort, mill, house, mound).
Horseshoe Pit	An area used to pitch horseshoes.
Interpretive Panel	Free-standing flat panel intended for the display of information; not roofed.
Kiosk	Roofed structure intended for the display information.
Laundry Building	Stand-alone laundry facility.
Lighthouse	Vertical structure that may be used as aid to navigation.
Lodge	Building with multiple fully-furnished rooms for overnight stays having self-contained bathrooms; includes dining area (e.g. Wakulla Springs State Park).
Marina	Area with docks and boat slips; typically provides restrooms and overnight boat camping.
Mooring Buoy	A permanent anchor dropped in the water and equipped with a floating buoy to which vessels can moor.
Museum	Facility built to provide interpretive displays, exhibits or programs about a specific event, individual, activity, etc.
National Register Site	A site, structures or items listed on the U.S. Department of the Interior's National Register of Historic Places. Properties listed in the Register include districts, sites, buildings, structures, and objects that are significant in American history, architecture, archeology, engineering, or culture.

Nature Trail	Short walking trail less than one (1) mile through a natural area.
Non-electric	Campsite with no electrical connection.
Observation Platform	Platform not attached to a building, for the purpose of observation.
Observation Tower	Stand-alone elevated tower for observation.
Paddling Trail	Linear corridor and any adjacent support parcels on land or water providing public access for recreation or authorized alternative modes of transportation.
Paddock	Open air divided enclosure for animals; not roofed.
Parking Areas	Paved and unpaved parking areas regularly used for visitor parking. Does not include temporary or overflow parking areas.
Parking Spaces	Delineated or undelineated stall for an individual vehicle within a regular visitor parking area. Does not include potential stalls in temporary or overflow parking areas.
Paved Road	Any road that has been improved with a paving material such as asphalt, concrete, brick or composite.
Picnic Pavilion Large	Open air shelter with 13-18 6' picnic tables.
Picnic Pavilion Medium	Open air shelter with 7-12 6' picnic tables.
Picnic Pavilion Small	Open air shelter with 1-6 6' picnic tables.
Pier	An elevated structure projecting into the water; typically used for fishing.
Playground	Structure designed specifically for children's recreational entertainment.
Pools	A pool that is open to the general public and registered campers for swimming including kiddie and wave pools.
Primitive Cabin	A rental unit designed primarily as a sleeper cabin which does not have a self-contained bathroom or kitchen facilities. Usually furnished with cots, table, and chairs. Often located in group camps with centralized bathhouses.
Primitive Campground	An area designated for camping with limited or no improvements such as a fire ring, cleared or partially cleared sites for tent camping, and if possible, potable water. Accessible by foot, bicycle or canoe/kayak only.
Primitive Campsite	A campsite with limited or no improvements.
Primitive Group Camp	An established campground designed for use by organized groups; typically includes restroom or pit toilets, fire circle and large tent campground (formally known as Youth Camp).
Restroom	Typically includes toilets and sinks with running water, but no shower facilities. Usually outside camping areas, but sometimes within primitive group camps.
Shelter - Waiting	Shelter dedicated for waiting, such as a tram waiting area or tour waiting area.
Shower Station	Stand-alone shower; typically found in swimming areas.
Slips/Moorings	A permanent structure to which a vessel may be secured.
Special Event Pavilion	A pavilion dedicated for special events.
Stabilized Road	Any road that had been marginally improved with a material such as crushed limestone, gravel, recycled asphalt/concrete/rubber.
Stable	Open air divided enclosure for animals, roofed with stalls.

Stage	Platform used for entertainment purposes.
Swimming Platform	Floating platform that is free to move with water levels and located within a designated swimming area.
Tent Only Site	Site within campground designated for tents only; usually has water and electricity. Site may be separated from the designated parking area and require a short walk. Sites with parking may be designated "tent only" per park policy.
Theater	Indoor space for specialized performances or interpretive programs with seating arranged in rows. May include designated areas for technical support, as well as a stage or viewing screen.
Trailer Parking	Delineated or undelineated stall for a horse trailer within or outside a regular visitor parking area.
Trailhead	Area designated for access to park trails; typically includes parking area, informational kiosk, restroom and potable water.
Underwater Observatory	Area allowing underwater viewing.
Unstabilized Road	Any road on natural soil surface without any additional material added (e.g. jeep trail).
Vacation Cabin	A rental unit having a self-contained kitchen and at least one bathroom and bedroom. Always includes water and electricity; typically includes central heating and cooling, linens and kitchen utensils/appliances.
Visitor Center	Facility built to provide general interpretive information about the park's natural and cultural resources, recreation activities, etc.
Volleyball Court	A area designated for playing volleyball.
