## How to interpret your drinking water system monitoring schedule:

- To find your system, hold the control key and press the F key. Type in the PWS ID and press enter.
- Contaminant Group column will indicate Inorganics, VOCs, SOCs, Secondary, or lead and copper
- Contaminant Name column will indicate a specific contaminant that may be on a special schedule. If no contaminant name is listed, the entire group of contaminants must be tested.
- Frequency column
  - A = annual, sample in 2020
  - T = triennial, sample in accordance with SMF. If for lead and copper, sample during June
     September on SMF.
  - Q = quarterly
  - B = Biannual, only for lead and copper. January June and July December 2020
  - I = Initial, only for lead and copper. January June and July December 2020
  - o R = Reduced, specifically lead and copper. Sample annual during June September 2020
- Location Column All Chems must be collected from the point of entry (POE). This may be indicated by AAA, AAB, or WTP1, etc. This is just a code for the POE in our database.
- Description Column All DBPs are collected in the distribution system. The description is the physical address of the sampling location. All other contaminants will be N/A.
- Quarter Column Only applicable for systems required to sample a contaminant in a specific quarter
  - O Q 1 = January, February, March
  - o Q 2 = April, May, June
  - o Q 3 = July, August, September
  - O Q 4 = October, November, December
- Date Column = the last day of the required monitoring period. For example, Q2 has and end date of 06/30/20.
- Comments Column May contain more specific instructions.

## **Other important information:**

- **Standard Monitoring Framework** (SMF) designates the year that systems conduct triennial monitoring based on system type and size
  - CWS population > 3,300 = 2020
  - CWS population < 3,300 = 2021</li>
  - O NTNC = 2022
- All systems must sample nitrate and nitrite from each point of entry (POE) annually
  - o If a system is on increased, quarterly monitoring for either contaminant, the frequency field will be set to Q for quarterly
- All DBPs must be sampling in accordance with approved plan. Plans can be found in OCULUS
  under the profile Sampling and the document type Disinfection By-Products Related
  - Contact DEP if you cannot locate a sampling plan
  - Samples collected outside of the timeframe on the plan will not be accepted.
  - Systems on quarterly must designate the *month and week* of sampling.
  - Systems on annual or triennial must designate the *month* of sampling.
- The Department recommends that samples are collected early to allow time for resampling during the monitoring period if needed and to avoid missed monitoring violations.

- These schedules are a good faith effort by the Department to inform systems of their sampling requirements. <u>Any error in the schedule does not relieve the system of their sampling</u> <u>requirements</u>. All systems must sample in accordance with <u>62-550 Florida Administrative</u> <u>Code</u>.
