# Intended Use of EPA Capitalization Grant — Base Grant and General Supplemental

#### **Source and Use** of DWSRF Funds State Fiscal **Year 22-23** + BIL Funding

The Safe Drinking Water Act requires that each state annually prepare an Intended Use Plan (IUP) to describe how it plans to use the DWSRF Program to meet its objectives.

The IUP must describe the following:

- Use of Federally-awarded state's capitalization grants, including additional BIL/IIJA funding, the required state match funds, and principal and interest earned from loan repayments.
- Use of other interest earnings of the DWSRF and other funds of the Program.
- Use of funds designated for set-aside activities.

We have not yet put an IUP together for the Emerging Contaminants and LSL Replacement Funding





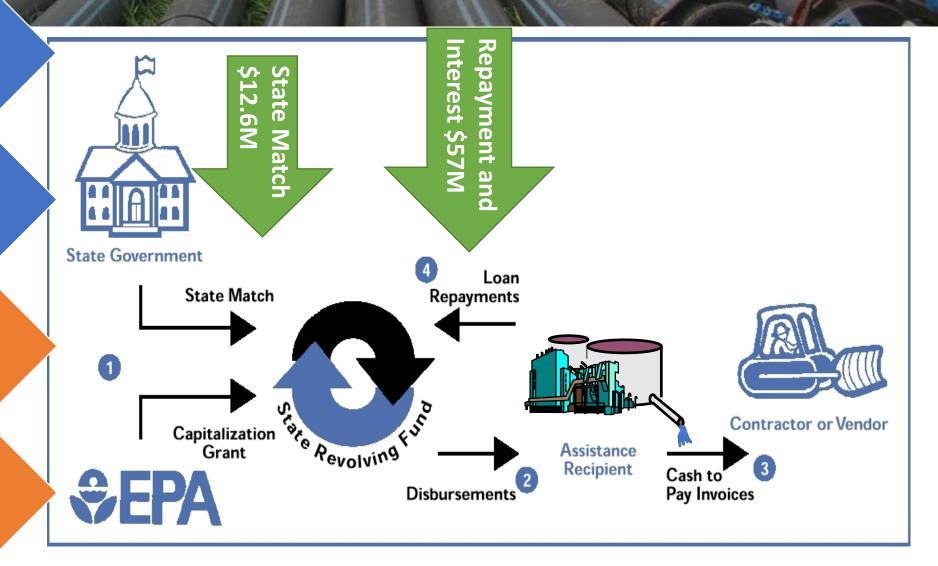
#### How Does the Program Work

- •Additional Subsidization Provide a percentage of our funding in the form of subsidy to disadvantaged communities (AKA Principal Forgiveness) min 26%
- **Green Infrastructure** Fund projects for water and energy efficiency
- Wage Rate Requirements Require borrowers to follow the Davis-Bacon Act
- Reporting Requirements Report use of DWSRF funds quarterly in the DWSRF reporting system and submit an annual report
- •Buy American Require all funded projects to comply with AIS and BIL and Cap Grant projects (equivalency) to comply with BABA
