Consider requests to remove approximately 16.38 acres from the boundary of the Bombing Range Ridge Florida Forever Project.

LOCATION:

Polk County

DSL STAFF REMARKS:

The Division received certified letters from the following owners requesting removal of their property from the project. The proposed removal includes 13 parcels within the River Ranch Property Owner's Association. These small lots range from 0.31 to 2.52 acres and are scattered throughout the project. Some of the parcels are developed and partially cleared and others are altered with a few containing natural communities.

This project was sponsored by the Florida Natural Areas Inventory and the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) when the Land Acquisition and Management Advisory Council added Bombing Range Ridge to the Conservation and Recreation Lands priority list in 1998. FWC and the Florida Forest Service are the designated managers for the project except for 540 acres adjacent to Rosalie Creek that will be managed by the Division of Recreation and Parks. The South Florida Water Management District, The Nature Conservancy,

United States Air Force, and Polk County have acquired and manage lands that are within or adjacent to the project boundary. The project currently includes 47,290 acres of which 29,263 remain to be acquired.

Pursuant to Rule 18-24.005(5)(a) and 18-24.007(2), F.A.C., ARC shall delete property from a Florida Forever project boundary if a landowner requests to do so by a certified letter. ARC may recommend that the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund (BOT) add such property back into the project boundary, if appropriate. Pursuant to Section 259.105(7)(b)2, Florida Statutes, the BOT has the option of adding this property back into the project boundary if the BOT determines that the property is critical to achieve the purposes of the project.

Vote to approve the owner-requested deletion, with no further recommendation to the Board of Trustees.

The FNAI database contains no records of rare species on any of the parcels.

The Florida Forever Measures Evaluation (FFME) following this memo is based on the Florida Forever Conservation Needs Assessment developed by FNAI. The data used in that analysis represent a standardized, statewide perspective of natural community distributions based primarily on data from the Cooperative Land Cover Map. All of the proposed combined removal contributes to Surface Water Protection and Aquifer Recharge. Nearly all of the combined removal contributes to FNAI Habitat Conservation Priorities and Ecological Greenways. Nearly two thirds of the combined removal contributes to Strategic Habitat Conservation Areas. See other resources in the table below.


