

Important Definitions

- Notice to Commence is the letter provided by staff after all Commencement documents are reviewed and
 accepted. The letter outlines Status Report requirements and reiterates the Project Completion deadline. The
 date this letter is issued is the date on which ground-breaking construction can occur.
- **Project Completion Date** is the date by which all development for a project must be complete. By this date, the project site must be open and available to the public. This date is always the last weekday of April of the year of expiration. FY 23-24's Completion Date is April 30, 2026. (Agreement, Attachment 3, Task 2, Deliverable 2, Due Date)
- **Date of Expiration** is when the funds for the grant are no longer available to be allocated to a community for reimbursement. FY 23-24's Expiration Date is June 30, 2026.



Important Definitions Continued

- Primary Facility is defined as "any facility which could stand alone and provide outdoor recreation without a support facility."
- Support Facility is defined as "a facility which could not stand alone, or which would have little or no public outdoor recreational value without the primary facility."

1. Entire Agreement.

This Grant Agreement, including any Attachments and Exhibits referred to herein and/or attached hereto (Agreement), constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior agreements, whether written or oral, with respect to such subject matter. Any terms and conditions included or Grantee's forms or invoices shall be null and void.

Grant Administration.

- Order of Precedence. If there are conflicting provisions among the documents that make up the Agreement, the order of precedence for interpretation of the Agreement is as follows: Standard Grant Agreement ii. Attachments other than Attachment 1, in numerical order as designated in the Standard Grant
 - iii Attachment 1 Standard Terms and Conditions
- The Exhibits in the order designated in the Standard Grant Agreement
- b. All approvals, written or verbal, and other written communication among the parties, including all notices, shall be obtained by or sent to the parties' Grant Managers. All written communication shall be by electronic mail. U.S. Mail, a courier delivery service, or delivered in person. Notices shall be considered delivered when reflected by an electronic mail read receipt, a courier service delivery receipt, other mail service delivery receipt, or when receipt is acknowledged by recipient. If the notice is delivered in multiple ways, the notice will be considered delivered at the earliest delivery time
- c. If a different Grant Manager is designated by either party after execution of this Agreement, notice of the name and contact information of the new Grant Manager will be submitted in writing to the other party and maintained in the respective parties' records. A change of Grant Manager does not require a formal amendment or change
- d. This Agreement may be amended, through a formal amendment or a change order, only by a written agreement between both parties. A formal amendment to this Agreement is required for changes which cause any of the
 - (1) an increase or decrease in the Agreement funding amount;
 - (2) a change in Grantee's match requirements;
 - (3) a change in the expiration date of the Agreement; and/or
- (4) changes to the cumulative amount of funding transfers between approved budget categories, as defined in Attachment 3, Grant Work Plan, that exceeds or is expected to exceed twenty percent (20%) of the total budget as last approved by Department.
- A change order to this Agreement may be used when:
- (1) task timelines within the current authorized Agreement period change;
- (2) the cumulative transfer of funds between approved budget categories, as defined in Attachment 3, Grant Work Plan, are less than twenty percent (20%) of the total budget as last approved by Department;
- (3) changing the current funding source as stated in the Standard Grant Agreement; and/or
- (4) fund transfers between budget categories for the purposes of meeting match requirements. This Agreement may be amended to provide for additional services if additional funding is made available by the
- All days in this Agreement are calendar days unless otherwise specified.

 Agreement Duration.
 The term of the Agreement shall begin and end on the dates indicated in the Standard Grant Agreement, unless extended or terminated earlier in accordance with the applicable terms and conditions. The Grantee shall be eligible for reimbursement for work performed on or after the date of execution through the expiration date of this Agreement, unless otherwise specified in Attachment 2, Special Terms and Conditions. This Project has been approved as a "Retroactive Project." Retroactive Projects are eligible for a FRDAP grant award if they otherwise meet the FRDAP rule criteria, funds are available, and Project Costs have occurred within one (1) year prior to the approval for funding by the Governor.

1. Project Submittal Forms.

Administrative Forms, Reimbursement Forms, and Guidelines referenced in this Agreement may be found at https://floridadep.gov/lands/land-and-recreation-grants/content/fidap-assistance, or by contacting the Department's

Prior to commencement of the Project, the Grantee shall submit to the Department for approval all documentation and completion of responsibilities listed on the Commencement Documentation Checklist, DRP-107. Upon satisfactory approval by the Department, the Department will issue written "Notice to Commence" to the Grantee to comm the Project. The Grantee SHALL NOT proceed until the Department issues the "Notice to Commence." Until the Department issues the "Notice to Commence," the Department is not obligated to pay or reimburse Grantee for fees, costs, or general expenses of any kind that were incurred prior to the "Notice to Commence," except for Pre-Agreement Expenses as more fully described in subsection 62D-5.054(34), F.A.C.

Project site facilities must be attractive for public use and compatible with the environment. Plans and specifications for Project site improvements and facilities must be in accordance with current engineering and architectural standards. The Grantee should emphasize the health and safety of users, accessibility to the general public, and the protection of the recreational and natural values of the area. The Grantee may alter a conceptual site plan only after written approval by the Department.

The Grantee shall have final site plans (site, engineering, and architectural) prepared for the Project and sealed by a registered architect or engineer licensed in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida (collectively the "Project Plans"). The Grantee must deliver a complete original, signed, and sealed set of the Project Plans to the Department before the Department will issue final reimbursement.

All work under this Agreement must be completed no later than 60 days before the expiration date of the Agreement, known as the "Project Completion Date." The Department may require the Grantse to do additional work before designating the Project Complete. If the Project has not been designating the 19th eye Portment by midnight of the project Complete in the Proj of the Date of Expiration, the Project funds will revert to the revenue fund from which they were appropriated (paragraph 62D-5.058(7)(a), F.A.C.).

5. Project Completion Certification.

To certify completion, the Grantee will submit to the Department the Project Completion Certification, DRP-112, available online and incorporated herein by reference. The Project must be designated complete prior to the Department releasing final reimbursement. The Department shall designate the Project complete upon receipt and approval of all deliverables and when Project site is open and available for use by the public for outdoor recreation purposes. The Department will release the retainage when the Department approves the Completion Documentation set forth in paragraph 62D-5.058(7)(d), F.A.C. The final payment of the retained amount will be processed within thirty (30) days of the Project designated complete by the Department.

- 6. The following modifies paragraph 8.d, Attachment 1, Standard Terms and Conditions:

Reimbursement for Costs.

Project Costs will be reimbursed as provided in paragraph 62D-5.058(2)(a), F.A.C., and in the Project Agreement. The Grantee is eligible for reimbursement, in whole or in part, for Department-approved Pre-Agreement Expenses

10. Status Reports.

The Grantee shall submit status reports quarterly, unless otherwise specified in the Attachments, on Exhibit A, Progress Report Form, to Department's Grant Manager describing the work performed during the reporting period, problems encountered, problem resolutions, scheduled updates, and proposed work for the next reporting period. Quarterly status reports are due no later than twenty (20) days following the completion of the quarterly reporting period. For the purposes of this reporting requirement, the quarterly reporting periods end on March 31, June 30, September 30 and December 31. The Department will review the required reports submitted by Grantee within thirty (30) days.

- 9. The following replaces paragraph 10, Attachment 1, Standard Terms and Conditions: Status Reports.
- a. The Grantee must utilize, Project Status Report Form, DRP-109, available online and incorporated herein by reference, to describe the work performed during the reporting period, problems encountered, problem resolutions, schedule updates and proposed work for the next reporting period. The Project Status Reports must be submitted to the Department's Grant Manager no later than January 5, May 5, and September 5. The Department's Grant Manager has thirty (30) calendar days to review the required reports and deliverables submitted by the Grantee.
- b. Additionally, the Grantee shall comply with the reporting and inventory requirements set forth in the Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan (SCORP), available online: https://floridadep.gov/parks/florida-scorp-outdoor-recreation-florida and hereby incorporated by reference, by updating the Florida Outdoor Recreation Inventory (FORI) system (https://floridadep.gov/parks/florida-outdoor-recreation-inventory).


Amendments

If for any reason, an element in the grant work plan cannot/will not be developed completely by the Project Completion Deadline (April 30, 2026), the element will have to be amended out of the scope.

An amendment will trigger a re-score of the project and if the score of the project falls <u>below</u> 54 points, the eligibility of the entire project will come under review.

When requesting an Amendment, the Grantee must submit the following to their CAC:

- 1. A letter, on letterhead, requesting the removal of the element from the scope.
 - a) This letter must say why the element is being removed (cost issues, procurement issues, etc.)
 - b) The letter must address *how* the funds set aside for this element will be reallocated.
 - "We request to amend the scope of work for project A22045, FRDAP Recreation Park, for the new playground to be removed from the project's scope of work. We are unable to procure the materials in time to meet the project completion deadline. The \$15,000 allocated towards the playground will be reallocated to the new picnic pavilion which is already a part of the agreement's scope of work".
- 2. A revised Site Plan showing the removal of the element in question.
- 3. A revised Budget Cost Analysis showing the reallocation of funds.
- 4. A confirmation that the project is on track to meet the project completion deadline (April 30, 2026).
