Statutory Authority:

Section 20.2551, F.S., Citizen support organizations; use of property; audit; public records; partnerships. In summary, the statute specifies the organizational requirements, operational parameters, duties of a CSO to support the Department of Environmental Protection (Department), or individual units of the Department, use of Department property, audit requirements, public records requirements, and authorizes public-private partnerships to enhance lands managed by the Department.

Section 258.015, F.S., Citizen support organizations; use of property; audit. In summary, the statute defines a CSO, requires authorization by the Division of Recreation and Parks, and specifies the use of property. This statute authorizes the Partnerships in Parks (PIP) program for state parks, the program's operational parameters, CSO's operational parameters, and donor recognition.

CSO's Mission: Consistent with Articles and Bylaws

The purpose of the organization is to conduct programs, foster activities, raise funds and make expenditures to facilitate and enhance the preservation and interpretation of the Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings Historic State Park, under the direction of and with priorities set by the Florida Division of Recreation and Parks and the Park Manager.

Program Service Description: A celebration of Rawlings' birthday with cake and music in the farmyard. The annual event generates interest in the Park as well as Rawlings. There was a brief program with a reading from Rawlings' cookbook.

Program Service Description: Play performed in Gainesville by acting group from St. Augustine with author reception before the performance.

Dec 7, 2019 "Life and Times in Cross Creek" program by Donna Green Townsend plus Annual Friends Meeting with overview of year and officers. (60 attended)

Program Service Description: This narrated video containing interviews, historic photos and film of Cross Creek and long-time residents was well received by the audience of Park neighbors and Friends members. The program was followed by the CSO Annual Meeting featuring a review of 2019.

Short Term Goals:

1. Plan and execute special events and programs. (see Programming report)

Very successful events during 2019. The Friends also supported a new "Writers' Talk Series" initiated by Ranger, Geoffrey Gates.

- 2. Provide period costumes for the staff conducting interpretation at the MKR Park.
- 3. Continue to restore antique fans for the farmhouse.
- 4. Continue to bring new, energized, and talented people to the Friends Board.

Added four new board members in 2019 (Meyer, Pagan, Price, Winn) who are assuming responsibilities already.

5. Address Greening of the Citrus with frequent fertilizer application to trees.

Additional fertilizer is being applied. There were supplies left from 2018, so no fertilizer was purchased. Fertilizer has been purchased in 2020 and applied.

- 6. Fund preventative maintenance of the Lawn Mowers including blades and oil changes.
- 8. Provide materials and seed for the seasonal garden.
- Replace entrance Kiosk and install trail markers for directions as well as quotes from MKR about natural areas, flora and fauna. Quotation trail sign project is underway

Long Term Goals:

- 1. Plan and implement programming at the Farm and in the community to enhance the visibility of the Park and the legacy of Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings. Ongoing
- 2. Maintain the integrity of the citrus grove replacing trees as needed. Ongoing.
- 3. Assist the Park in taking care of the Farmyard and Rawlings Farmhouse.
- 4. Continue and expand he relationship with the Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings Elementary School. Looking for a person in the Friends who has an interest in developing a connection with the school.
- 5. Continue to produce a high-quality newsletter quarterly and rework the Friends website with timely updates. Being done quarterly. See Newsletter copies for 2019 in this packet. Allocation each year for this to continue.
- 6. Plan a budget and events based upon goals developed in cooperation with Park personnel. Budget 2019 and 2020 attached.
- 7. Recruit new members for the Friends of the MKR Farm; retain existing members. Continuing effort especially at Park events with a membership table staffed by Friends representatives.
- 8. Ensure the viability of the Friends organization by fundraising and grant participation to support the Friends projects. Fundraising at all MKR Park related events as well as the MKR Society Annual Conferences.
- 9. **Continue the relationship with Rawlings Collection Staff at UF Libraries.** This continues through the presence on the Board of the Curator of the Rawlings Collection, Florence Turcotte.
- 10. Continue the relationship with the Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings Society and the Matheson History Museum. Overlapping members in the MKR Society as well on the two boards. The President of the Friends is on the Advisory Board of the Matheson Museum.
- 11. Network with other CSOs for ideas and resources. Currently, done through memos from the district and information from the Park Manager.
- 12. Acquire a golf cart for work around the farm such as hauling materials, etc. Purchase of golf cart is underway.
- 13. Institute an annual Volunteer/CSO Award Banquet. Being planned for 2020.

In addition to the above goals that were accomplished, with the use of volunteers the Friends has begun a fundraising project of making books by Rawlings available to visitors at the Park. Through this effort during October through December, \$2524 in sales were collected for a profit of about \$1000. These funds will help fund purchase of a utility vehicle, kiosk construction and trail signs in coming years.

Friends of the Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings Farm, Inc. CODE OF ETHICS

PREAMBLE

- (1) It is essential to the proper conduct and operation of the Friends of the Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings Farm, Inc. (herein "CSO") that its board members, officers, and employees be independent and impartial and that their position not be used for private gain. Therefore, the Florida Legislature in Section 112.3251, Florida Statute (Fla. Stat.), requires that the law protect against any conflict of interest and establish standards for the conduct of CSO board members, officers, and employees in situations where conflicts may exist.
 - (2) It is hereby declared to be the policy of the state that no CSO board member, officer, or employee shall have any interest, financial or otherwise, direct or indirect, or incur any obligation of any nature which is in substantial conflict with the proper discharge of his or her duties for the CSO. To implement this policy and strengthen the faith and confidence of the people in Citizen Support Organizations, there is enacted a code of ethics setting forth standards of conduct required of CSO board members, officers, and employees in the performance of their official duties.

STANDARDS

The following standards of conduct are enumerated in Chapter 112, Fla. Stat., and are required by Section 112.3251, Fla. Stat., to be observed by CSO board members, officers, and employees.

1. Prohibition of Solicitation or Acceptance of Gifts

No CSO board member, officer, or employee shall solicit or accept anything of value to the recipient, including a gift, loan, reward, promise of future employment, favor, or service, based upon any understanding that the vote, official action, or judgment of the CSO board member, officer, or employee would be influenced thereby.

2. Prohibition of Accepting Compensation Given to Influence a Vote

No CSO board member, officer, or employee shall accept any compensation, payment, or thing of value when the person knows, or, with reasonable care, should know that it was given to influence a vote or other action in which the CSO board member, officer, or employee was expected to participate in his or her official capacity.

3. Salary and Expenses

No CSO board member or officer shall be prohibited from voting on a matter affecting his or her salary, expenses, or other compensation as a CSO board member or officer, as provided by law.

4. Prohibition of Misuse of Position

A CSO board member, officer, or employee shall not corruptly use or attempt to use one's official position or any property or resource which may be within one's trust, or perform official duties, to secure a special privilege, benefit, or exemption.

5. Prohibition of Misuse of Privileged Information

No CSO board member, officer, or employee shall disclose or use information not available to members of the general public and gained by reason of one's official position for one's own personal gain or benefit or for the personal gain or benefit of any other person or business entity.

6. Post-Office/Employment Restrictions

A person who has been elected to any CSO board or office or who is employed by a CSO may not personally represent another person or entity for compensation before the governing body of the CSO of which he or she was a board member, officer, or employee for a period of two years after he or she vacates that office or employment position.

7. Prohibition of Employees Holding Office

No person may be, at one time, both a CSO employee and a CSO board member at the same time.

8. Requirements to Abstain From Voting

A CSO board member or officer shall not vote in official capacity upon any measure which would affect his or her special private gain or loss, or which he or she knows would affect the special gain or any principal by whom the board member or officer is retained. When abstaining, the CSO board member or officer, prior to the vote being taken, shall make every reasonable effort to disclose the nature of his or her interest as a public record in a memorandum filed with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting, who shall incorporate the memorandum in the minutes. If it is not possible for the CSO board member or officer to file a memorandum before the vote, the memorandum must be filed with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting no later than 15 days after the vote.

9. Failure to Observe CSO Code of Ethics

Failure of a CSO board member, officer, or employee to observe the Code of Ethics may result in the removal of that person from their position. Further, failure of the CSO to observe the Code of Ethics may result in the Florida Department of Environmental Protection terminating its Agreement with t
