

RESTORE Council members include governors of AL, FL, LA, MS, and TX, as well as secretaries or administrator of six federal agencies.






# **Geographical Extent**


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
## **Project Screening**





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- Include citations/bibliography.
- **Discuss applicable regional plans** (e.g., Basin Management Action Plan, Minimum Flow Level, Surface Water Improvement and Management Plan, State Expenditure Plans).
- Consider all project risks and uncertainties.
  - Short- and long-term sustainability and effects of implementation.
- Discuss monitoring an adaptive management (as applicable).
- Discuss plan for data management and accessibility.




