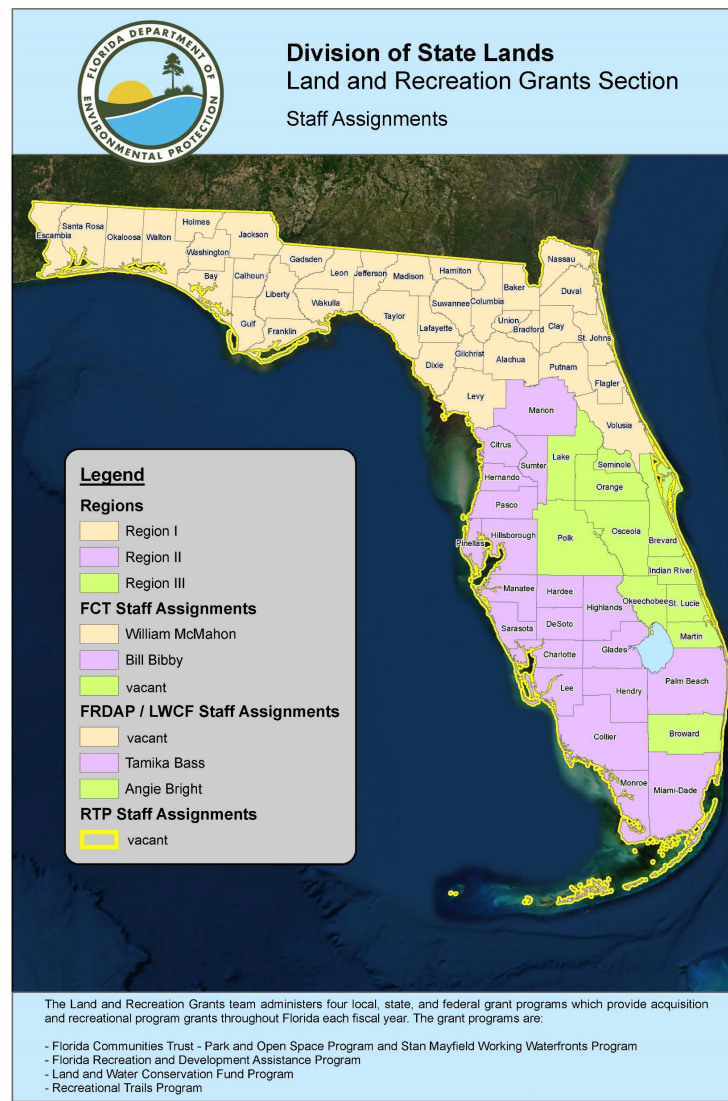

# Program Overview

## Definition of “Working Waterfront”

- A parcel or parcels of land used for commercial marine harvest
- A parcel or parcels used for exhibitions, demonstrations, educational venues, civic events – promote the heritage of working waterfronts

## Who is Eligible?

- Florida Local Governments
- Non-profit Working Waterfronts Organizations
- Partnership between a Florida Local Government and Non-profit Working Waterfronts Organization

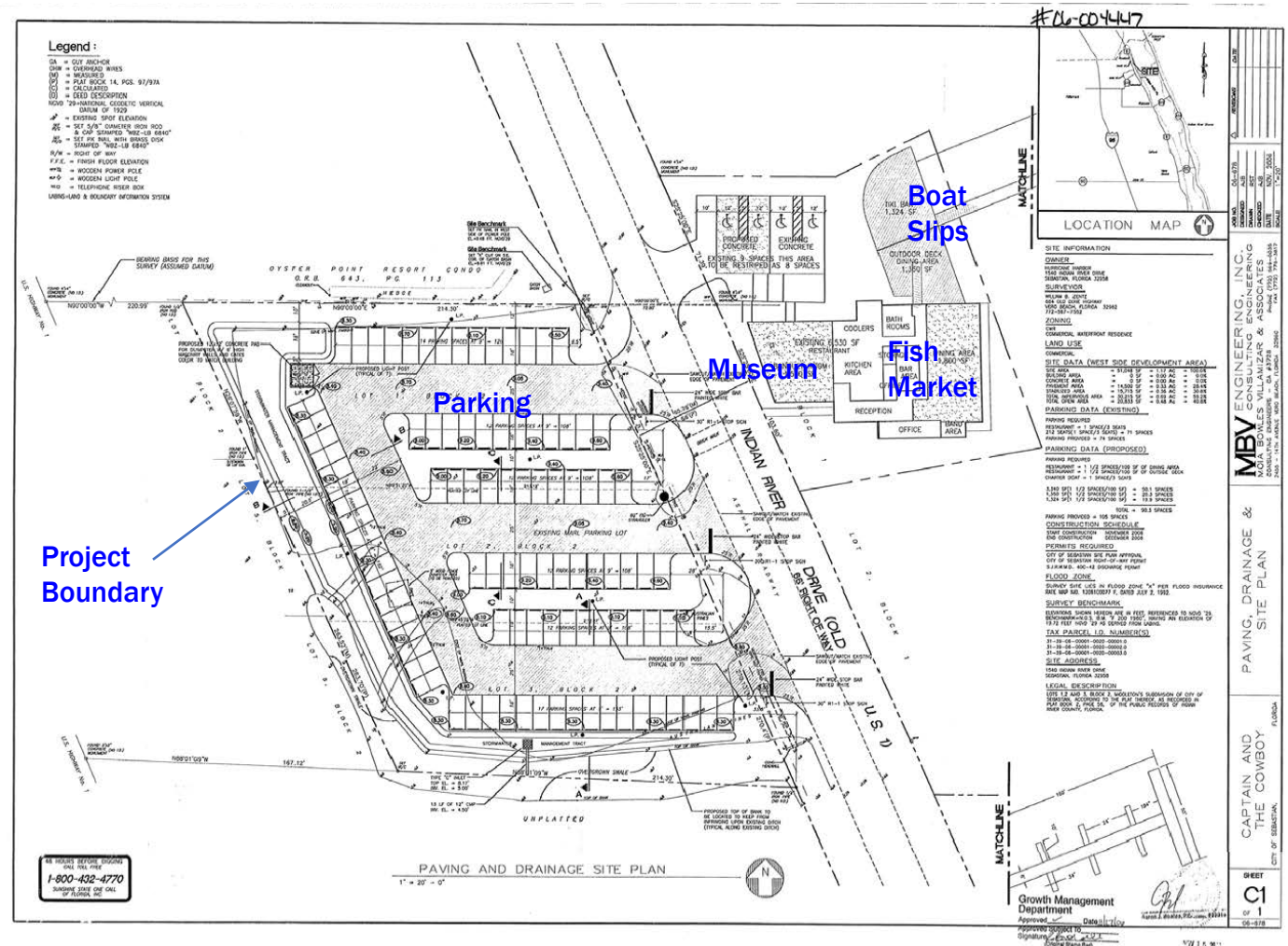

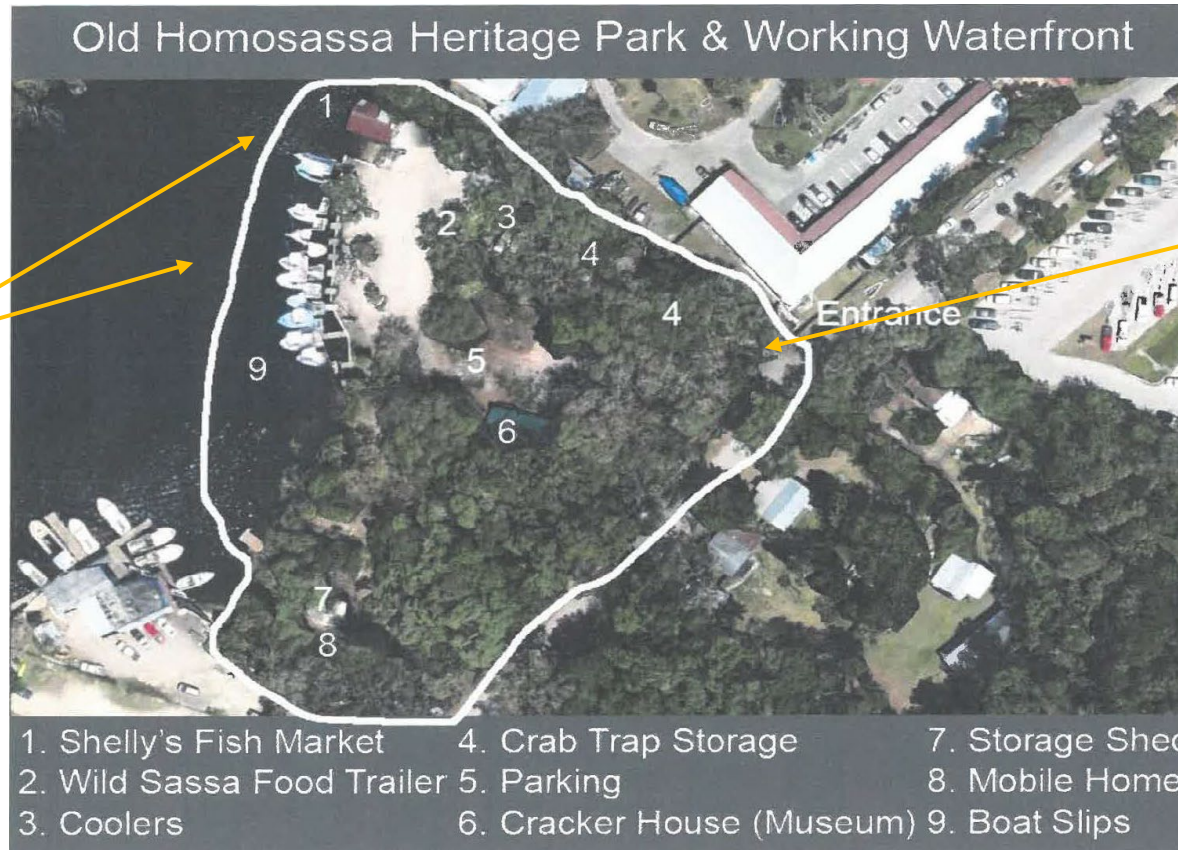

- Review and score, including sufficiency of Business Summary
- Site Visit
- Score Report / Business Summary Determination
- Written Objections

- **Part IV –**
  - Submitted to DEP's Office of Inspector General and State Auditor General
  - Less than \$750,000 – Exempt

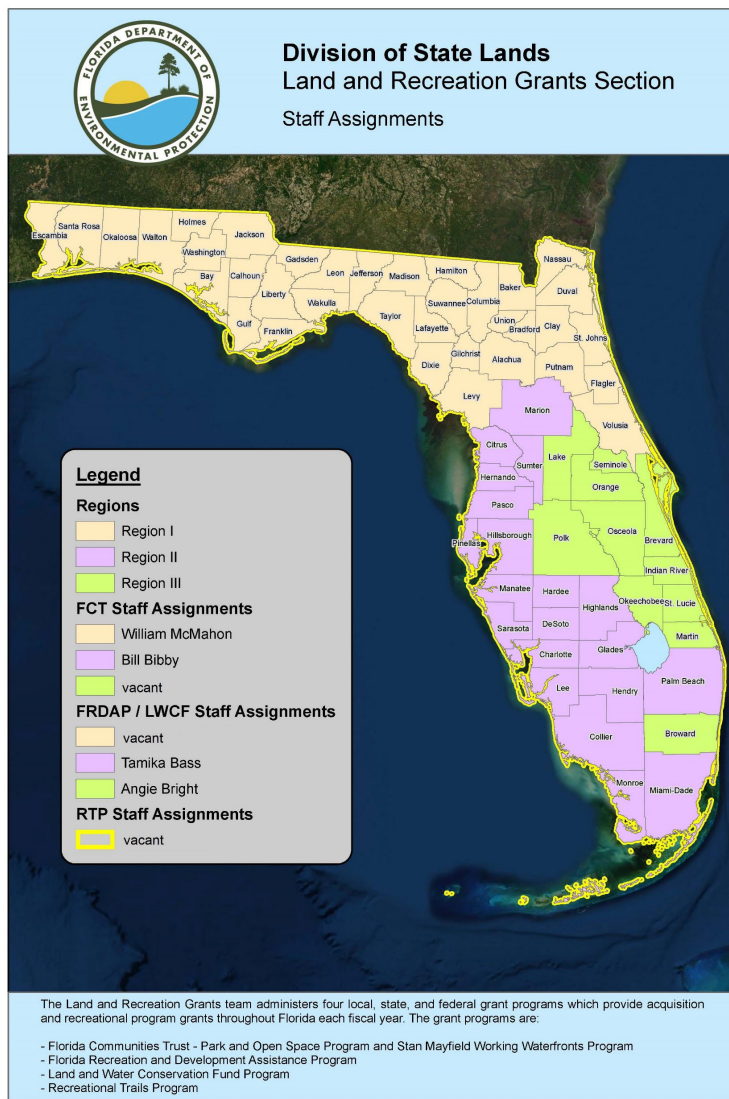
