Jerrie Lindsey is the director of the Public Access and Wildlife Viewing Services Office for the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. Her office plans and develops wildlife recreation opportunities on FWC-managed lands; promotes wildlife viewing through programs such as the Great Florida Birding and Wildlife Trail and Wings over Florida, and recruits and manages volunteer citizen scientists and conservation stewards. A major focus for the office is to develop interpretive materials for visitors to wildlife management areas and to support conservation education and outreach programs throughout the agency. Jerrie's education is in Sociology and Recreation Planning. Prior to joining FWC she worked for the Florida Advisory Council on

Environmental Education, the Florida Park Service and the Florida Recreation and Park Association. She is an enthusiastic though nearsighted birder and enjoys canoeing and kayaking Florida's rivers.
