

The St. Johns River-to-Sea Loop

The St. Johns River-to-Sea Loop is a 260-mile paved multi-use trail project underway in northeast Florida. It runs through five Florida counties, includes the entire Palatka-to-St. Augustine State Trail, and is part of the 3,000-mile East Coast Greenway. It also overlaps with the Florida Coast-to-Coast Trail and other long-distance trail corridors.

The Loop, as well as the <u>Florida Coast-to-Coast Trail</u>, are currently the top two priority long-distance regional trails receiving funding through the <u>Shared-Use Nonmotorized (SUN) Trail Program</u> administered by the Florida Department of Transportation. Local governments are also providing funding for some sections along the route.

The non-profit <u>St. Johns River-to-Sea Loop Alliance</u> is the primary organization that advocates for the Loop. The Alliance website features maps, updates and articles about the Loop and it organizes trail summits, celebrations and other events.

The <u>St. Johns River-to-Sea Loop Strategic Plan</u>, completed in May of 2018, outlines the vision for completing, managing, marketing and promoting the Loop.
