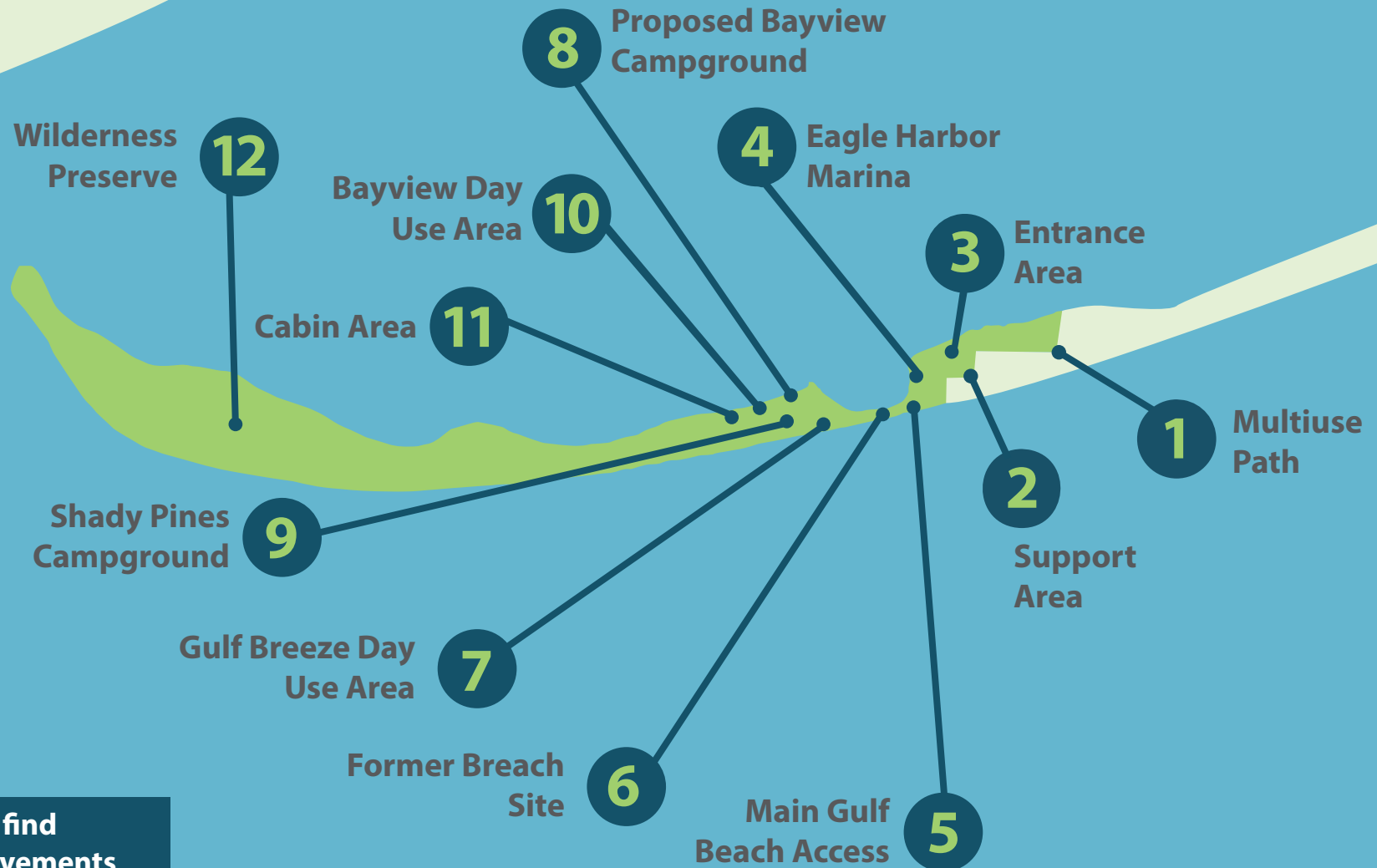

Hurricane Michael left lasting changes at T.H. Stone Memorial St. Joseph Peninsula State Park. The resilient coastal ecosystems are rebounding. In the wilderness preserve area, oaks and pines are sprouting green in the understory of the damaged trees. The dunes are growing slowly. The breach has filled. This plan details improvements to the recreation facilities in the park.

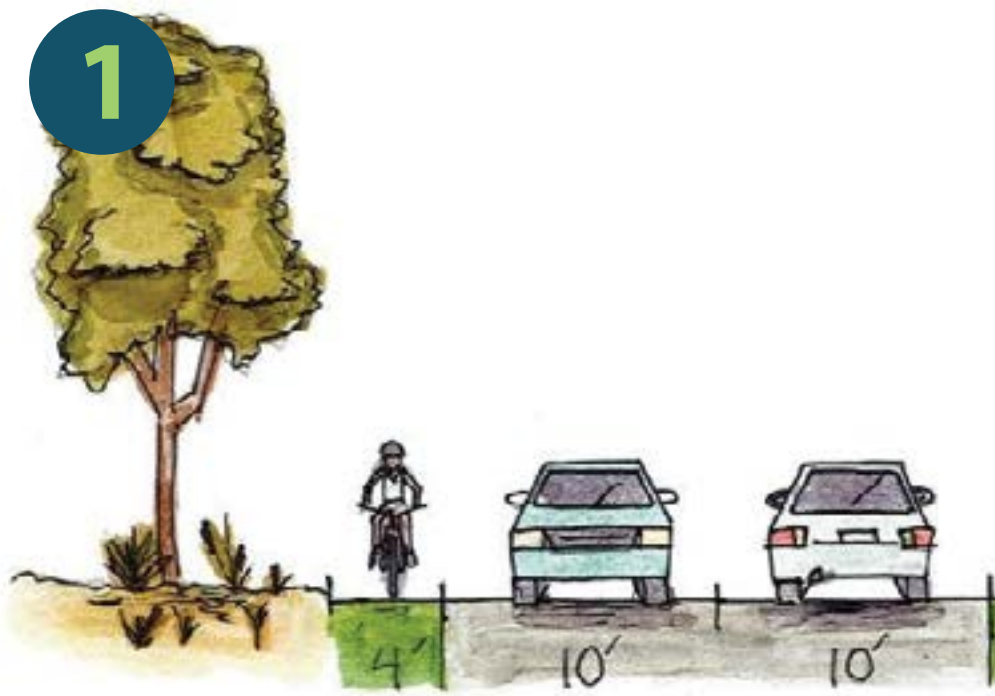

Multiuse Path

With the redesign of the park, the division proposes adding a multiuse path to the facilities at the park. The multiuse path will run parallel to the park road, separated by a natural buffer, to encourage safe bicycle and pedestrian access.

Proposed Changes | July 2022 Estimated Completion

- Create a multiuse path parallel to park road
- Allow for a natural landscape buffer

Future Enhancements | No Timeframe

- In the future, this multiuse path will extend from the Cape San Blas trail to the Eagle Harbor and Main Gulf Beach Access areas
