



The National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Stormwater & Technical Services Program regulates point source discharges from three potential sources:

- Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4s).
- Construction activities.
- Industrial activities.



#### **DEP** regulates industrial facilities that:

 Have stormwater discharges to surface waters of the state or into an MS4.

#### **AND**

 Are included in any one of the 11 categories of "stormwater discharges associated with industrial activity" identified in 40 Code of Federal Regulations 122.26(b)(14), (adopted by reference within Rule 62-620, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.)).



DEP's authority to administer the NPDES Program is set forth in section 403.0885, Florida Statutes.

- Multi Sector Generic Permit (MSGP).
  - Rule 62-621.300(5), F.A.C.
- No Exposure Exclusions (NEX).
  - Rule 62-620.910(17), F.A.C.



- MSGP permits have the prefix of FLR05.
- NEX permits have the prefix of FLRNEE or FLRNEF.



### **MSGP**

 Required for facilities whose activities that have the potential to discharge stormwater to waters of the State or to and MS4.

#### NEX

 The No Exposure Certification exists for industrial facilities whose industrial materials and activities are protected by a storm-resistant structure.



# Industrial Stormwater Discharge

- Stormwater runoff is generated from rain events that flow over land or impervious surfaces, such as paved streets, parking lots and building rooftops, and does not soak into the ground.
- Stormwater runoff can pollute water bodies by coming into contact with exposed materials and industrial activities.

- Sector H: Coal Mines.
- Sector I: Oil and Gas Extraction.
- Sector J: Mineral Mining.
- Sector K: Waste Treatment.
- Sector L: Landfills.
- Sector M: Auto Salvage Yards.
- Sector N: Scrap Recycling.
- Sector 0: Power Plants (Steam).
- Sector P: Land Transportation.

- Sector Q: Water Transportation.
- Sector R: Ship & Boat Repairing.
- Sector S: Air Transportation.
- Sector T: Treatment Works.
- Sector U: Food & Kindred Products.
- Sector V: Textile Mills.
- Sector W: Wood and Metal Furniture/Fixtures.
- Sector X: Printing & Publishing.
- Sector Y: Plastics Manufacturing.
- Sector Z: Leather Tanning & Finishing.
- Sector AA: Fabricated Metal Products.
- Sector AB: Transportation Equip.
- Sector AC: Electronic Goods.
- Sector AD: Additional Activities.



### Notice Center Designation Process

- Check for existing NPDES permit coverage.
- Permitted check for any outstanding compliance issues.
- Unpermitted correspond with facility about dayto-day activities at the facility for permit applicability.



### Sector Q: SIC Code 4493

- Vessel and equipment fluid changes.
- Mechanical repairs, parts cleaning.
- Sanding.
- Blasting.
- Welding.
- Refinishing.
- Painting.
- Fueling.
- Vessel and vehicle exterior wash-down.



## Sector R: SIC Codes 3731 and 3732

- Building and repairing ships, barges and lighters.
- Alteration of ships.
- Build and repair of fiberglass boats.
- Conversion and alteration of ships.
- Manufacture boat kits, not a model.
- Cargo vessels, building and repairing.
- Combat ships, building and repairing.
- Crew boats, building and repairing.
- Dredges, building and repairing.
