Wastewater Annual Fee Waiver Guide For Fiscal Year 2026

The following guidance addresses Wastewater annual fee waiver pursuant to <u>Section 218.075, F.S.</u>

If the County or Municipality does not meet the Applicability Requirement, please do not apply

- A. **Applicability Requirement** The fee reduction provision applies <u>only</u> to the following <u>and</u> must meet one of the 5 economic criteria specified in <u>Section 218.075</u>, F.S.
 - 1. Counties of population 50,000 or less on <u>April 1, 1994</u>, until such counties exceed a population of 75,000. *see attached list of Counties that qualified in 1994 and section B. below.
 - 2. Municipalities with a population of <u>25,000 or less</u> *see section B. below.
 - 3. Any entity created by special act, local ordinance, or interlocal agreement of such Counties or Municipalities defined above *refer to number 1. or 2. above.
 - 4. Any County or Municipality <u>not</u> included within a metropolitan statistical area
- B. **Economic Criteria** Supporting documentation may be obtained from the Department of Revenue (DOR), Research and Analysis Unit. Go to https://floridarevenue.com/property/Pages/Cofficial.aspx

- C. **Financial Criteria** One of the financial criteria under which some applicable entities might apply is for "a state of <u>financial</u> emergency". Supporting documentation for this provision can be determined by referring to <u>Section 218.503(1) F.S.</u>.
- E. **Request** Applicable Counties and Municipalities should email the following 3 items in <u>one</u> pdf:
 - 2. **Invoice** for the current fiscal year
 - 3. Worksheet completed and signed *Please physically sign and scan.
 - 4. **Permit Fee Reduction Memo** for the current year from the Department of Revenue
 - *If emailing, please submit all 3 items in only <u>one</u> pdf and email to <u>Noreen.Biernacki@FloridaDEP.gov</u> or mail to the Department of Environmental Protection, Division of Water Resource Management, c/o Noreen Biernacki, 2600 Blair Stone Rd., Tallahassee, FL 32399. - F. **Approval** After review of the request, if the applicable entity qualifies, the fee will be waived in its entirety for the currently invoiced fiscal year applying.

Florida Statutes

Title XIV Taxation and Finance

Chapter 218 Financial Matters Pertaining to Political Subdivisions

218.075 Reduction or waiver of permit processing fees.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Department of Environmental Protection and the water management districts shall reduce or waive permit processing fees for counties with a population of 50,000 or less on April 1, 1994, until such counties exceed a population of 75,000 and municipalities with a population of 25,000 or less, or for an entity created by special act, local ordinance, or interlocal agreement of such counties or municipalities, or for any county or municipality not included within a metropolitan statistical area. Fee reductions or waivers shall be approved on the basis of fiscal hardship or environmental need for a particular project or activity. The governing body must certify that the cost of the permit processing fee is a fiscal hardship due to one of the following factors:

- (1) Per capita taxable value is less than the statewide average for the current fiscal year;
- (2) Percentage of assessed property value that is exempt from ad valorem taxation is higher than the statewide average for the current fiscal year;
- (3) Any condition specified in <u>s. 218.503(1)</u> which results in the county or municipality being in a state of financial emergency;
- (4) Ad valorem operating millage rate for the current fiscal year is greater than 8 mills; or
- (5) A financial condition that is documented in annual financial statements at the end of the current fiscal year and indicates an inability to pay the permit processing fee during that fiscal year.

The permit applicant must be the governing body of a county or municipality or a third party under contract with a county or municipality or an entity created by special act, local ordinance, or interlocal agreement and the project for which the fee reduction or waiver is sought must serve a public purpose. If a permit processing fee is reduced, the total fee shall not exceed \$100.
